Saturday Aug. 18th 1866.

This day fine weather and light airs all 4 Boats ~~crucising~~ ^{hunting} for whales saw none
Boats all camping on the land at night. So ends today
Sunday Aug. 19th 1866.

This day fine weather and light winds from the N.E. all the Boats cruising for whales saw 2 whales. Waist Boat got a small whale and killed it at 6 Pm Capt and 2 mate came towing him to the Ship So ends this day
Monday Aug. 20th 1866.

This day commenced with strong breezes from S.E. got the whale along side at 8 a.m. turned in and slept 4 hours. 2^d mate returned to N.E. Bay. Capt and Ship keepers cut in the whale no whales seen in the Bay to day So ends this day
Tuesday Aug. 21st 1866.

This day commenced with fine weather and light Northerly winds all 4 Boats in N.E. Bay saw 2 whales. Comelia got 1. So ends.
Wednesday Aug. 22nd 1866.

This day fine pleasant weather and light Northerly winds Capt and 2^d mate went up to the Head of Repulse Bay saw 3 whales all very shy also plenty of Seal.
Thursday Aug. 23rd 1866.

This day fine pleasant weather and light winds from S.E. saw 1 whale in Repulse Bay. to day Capt. and 2^d mate went to the skaters Camp got a fresh deer and returned to the Ship at dark. mate and 3^d mate in N.E. Bay So ends this day.

In Repulse Bay Greenland.
Friday Aug. 24th 1866.

This day fine pleasant weather and light Southerly winds Capt and 2^d mate cruising N.E. Bay for whales mate and 3^d mate in Repulse Bay. No whales seen to day.
Saturday Aug. 25th 1866.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and strong breezes from the North. all the Boats on the Beach one whale seen to day. Widdly and Latter Port more moderate So ends this 24 hours.
Sunday Aug. 26th 1866.

This day fine pleasant weather and light baffling winds Waist Boat got a whale Capt and 2^d mate towed him across the Bay. 2^d mate and 3^d mate towed him to the Ship several whales seen to day.
Monday Aug. 27th 1866.

This day fine pleasant weather and light baffling winds mate and 3^d mate cut their whale in to the Ship. Capt and 2^d mate cut their whale on the rocks and towed the Blubber to the Ship one whale seen to day.
Tuesday Aug. 28th 1866.

This day fine weather and light baffling winds plenty of Pack Ice in the Bay all Boats off cruising for whales. none seen to day.
Wednesday Aug. 29th 1866.

This day fine weather & light westerly winds all the Boats off cruising for whales. saw 4 Ansel Gibbs struck a whale and drew his Spoons. plenty of heavy ice in the Harbor So ends this day.
