

Bergua Black Eagle. Edwin P. White Master
Wednesday Sept 19th 1866.

This day commenced with fine weather and strong breeze from the N. W. Middle & Latter Part. most moderate mate & 3rd mate came on board. saw no whales. So ends this day.

Thursday Sept 20th 1866.

All this day fine weather and light baffling winds, all the boats lowered at daylight. mate and 3rd mate returned to camp. 2nd mate got a Bear and returned on board at night. no whales seen to day ends fine.

Friday Sept 21st 1866.

All this day light baffling winds and fine pleasant weather all boats off, cruising for whales. But saw none all the day. Captain returned from Core Bay. saw 2 whales. and shot 8 deer & 100 Arrouse. So ends today.

Saturday Sept 22nd 1866.

All this day fine weather and light baffling winds all the boats off, cruising for whales. saw none our mate came from the Herd of the Bay in C. with mate of the Glacier having 8 deer. Capt and 2nd mate returned to the ship at night with 30 fowl.

Sunday Sept 23rd 1866.

All this day fine weather & light baffling winds all boats whaling and hunting. Saw no whales. So ends this day.

Monday Sept 24th 1866.

This day fine weather and light airs. Stab & Mail-Boats crews employed in fetching ship and clearing house. So ends this day.

Lying in, Repulse, Bay, Greenland.
Tuesday Sept 25th 1866.

This day cloudy weather and light N. W. winds all hands hunting got 2 deer and 4 rabbits wounded several other deer. returned on board at night. Bay full of Icebergs this day.

Wednesday Sept 26th

This day fine weather and light Easterly winds all hands hunting got a Bear 16 Geese and 3 ducks. and put a raft of casks on shore. So ends.

Thursday Sept 27th 1866.

All this day fine weather and light baffling winds accompanied with snow. 2 Boats off hunting Stewards had a fit and the Capt stepped on board to take care of Stewards. So ends this day.

Friday Sept 28th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and light Easterly winds 2 Boats off hunting 2nd mate shot 12 ducks and Coople 14 Grouse. got a cask of Fresh Water from the Glacier ends fine.

Friday Sept 29th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and fresh breeze from the West. Starboard Watch employed in breaking out the run mate and 3rd mate returned to the ship leaving the 3rd mate boat on the beach. having to haul over 2 miles of Ice. So ends this day.

Saturday Sept 30th 1866.

and light Westerly All this day fine weather and light Westerly winds. all hands on board. So ends this day.
