Tuesday Oct. 30th 1866.

This day strong breezes from the
S.E. Mr. Hall came to the Ship to day So ends.
Wednesday Oct. 31st 1866.

All this day stormy weather
and wind N.E. Blowing a gale So ends this day.
Thursday Nov 1st 1866.

All this day thick Snow storm
and strong breezes from the N.E. Mr. Hall &
Captain Killmer went up to Gibsons Cove with
one native. So ends this day.

Friday Nov 2nd 1866.
All this day fine weather and wind
N.W. got off a load of ice So ends this day.

Saturday Nov 3rd 1866.
This day cloudy weather
and light Easterly winds So ends this day.

Sunday Nov 4th 1866.
All this day fine pleasant
weather and light N.W. winds So ends this day.
Monday Nov 5th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and
thick N.E. Snow storm 2 Polley Bay natives
came to the Schooner Cornelia. Having shot over
100 deer. This fall. So ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 6th 1866.
All this day strong breezes from
the N.W. Ther 8 above zero. So ends this day.

Wednesday Nov 7th 1866.
This day fine weather &
light winds from the West 8 above zero So
ends this day.

Lying in Winter quarters Repulse Bay.
Thursday Nov 8th 1866.

This day fine weather and light
baffling winds Ther 8 above zero. all hands employed
in sledging off snow to the ships one native came
to the ships to day So ends this day.

Friday Nov 9th 1866.
This day fine weather and light
westerly winds. all hands employed in banking up
Ship. So ends this 24 hours.

Saturday Nov 10th 1866.
All this day cloudy weather
and light Easterly winds. all hands employed in
banking up ship So ends this day.

Sunday Nov 11th 1866.
This day cloudy weather and
light baffling winds Blucher and Mr. Cropp
went in to the main Land. after a load of skins
returned again at dark so ends this day.

Monday Nov 12th 1866.
All this day cloudy weather
and light winds from the North East. employed
in banking up and hauling snow for a Black
smiths Shop. So ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 13th 1866.
This day cloudy weather and
light baffling winds. all hands employed in banking
up Ship. ends with a gale from the S.E.
Wednesday Nov 14th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather &
light southerly winds a lot of natives came to
the ships. all hands employed in banking ship
So ends this day.
