

Barque Black Eagle, Edwin H. White Master.
Thursday Nov 15th 1866.

All this day High winds from the North. all hands employed in Banking up Ship. So ends this 24 hours.

Friday Nov 16th 1866.

This day heavy gales from the N.E. accompanied with thick snow storm. So ends this day.

Saturday Nov 17th 1866.

All this day, cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N.E. crew employed in Banking up Ship. So ends this day.

Sunday, Nov 18th 1866.

All this day fine weather and light winds from the N.E. So ends this day.
Monday, Nov 19th 1866.

All this day fine weather and light westerly winds all hands employed in Banking up the Ship's stern. So ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 20th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N.E. all hands employed in Banking in Ship one family of natives came to the anchor Gibbs to day So ends.

Wednesday Nov 21st 1866.

This day fine weather and fresh breezes from the N.E. There is below zero. the 2^d mate and mate of the Glacier started with one native for the native settlement. and arrived at 2 P.M. a distance of 20 miles from the Ship. and camp'd for the night. So ends this day.

Ling in winter quarters Repulse Bay Greenland
Thursday Nov 22nd 1866.

All this day fine weather. There 20 below zero. 2^d mate returned to the Ship with all of this tribe and several of another. So ends this day.
Friday Nov 23rd 1866.

This day fine weather and strong breezes from the N.E. There 30 deg below F.

Saturday Nov 24th 1866.

This day fine weather and strong westerly winds 2 of the Pelly Bay natives came to the Cornelius. to day So ends this day.

Sunday Nov 25th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather & quite cold. 8 natives came to the Ship to day from the Shaleketa tribe. having never seen a ship or white man before. So ends this day.

Monday, Nov 26th 1866.

All this day fine weather and strong breezes from the N.E. Explains White Baker and Potter started off with 5 dog teams to go to the Shaleketa natives. So ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 27th 1866.

This day fine weather & light westerly winds all the Captains returned with several families of natives. Captain White took another family of natives too keep So ends this twenty four hours.

Wednesday Nov 28th 1866.

All this day fine clear weather and fresh northerly winds So ends this day.
