

Barge Black Eagle Edwin B. White Master.
Thursday Nov 28th 1866.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light westerly winds employed in fitting up the Amel Gibbs house with flags for a ball. All the Captains and Officers wore dresses to represent different characters. So ends this day.

Friday Nov 30th 1866.

This day heavy gales from the N.E. and thick snow storm. So ends this day.
Saturday December 1st 1866.

This day wind fresh from the N.E. with some snow So ends this day.

Sunday Dec 2^d 1866.

All this day thick snow storm and strong breezes from N.E. So ends this day.

Monday Dec 3^d 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and light N.E. winds So ends this day Capt White & Little went off with the native to day.

All this day cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N.E. It got off a load of ice and broke out provisions then 6 above zero. So ends this day
Wednesday Dec 5th 1866.

All this day wind N.E. and thick snow storm the Captains arrived at 2 P.M. with the remainder of the Shaloketa natives So ends this day

Thursday Dec 6th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N.E. accompanied with light snow. got off a load of ice Captains and Officers had a dance to night. So ends this day.

Fishing in winter quarters Repulse Bay Greenland
Friday Dec 7th 1866.

All this day cloudy weather and fish breezes from the North accompanied with snow So ends this day.
Saturday Dec 8th 1866.

This day commenced with light winds from the N.E. Middle and latter part fine clear weather and strong breezes from the North So ends this day. (Pelly Bay natives came to day)
Sunday Dec 9th 1866.

All this day heavy gales from the N.W. and cloudy weather snow blowing quite fast So ends this day.
Monday Dec 10th 1866.

All this day heavy gales from the N.W. with thick snow storm. Ther 10 below zero. So ends this day.
Tuesday Dec 11th 1866.

All this day heavy gales from the N.W. accompanied with thick snow storm Ther 14 below zero. So ends this day.
Wednesday Dec 12th 1866.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the N.W. Thermometer 12 above zero latter part light winds from the N.W. and fine clear weather all the Captains getting ready to go fishing with the natives. Several of the Pelly Bay natives came to the Cornelia to day So ends this day.

Thursday Dec 13th 1866.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from N.W. to N. S.W. Ther 20° Below zero. all 4 of the Captains with 8 natives and two dog teams went fishing So ends this day.
