

Barge, Black Eagle, Edwin, W. White Master.
Thursday, March 7th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S.W. several of the natives went sealing to day. But got nothing. Spiddle & latter part fine with light E. winds. The 3rd mate and 3rd mate of the Glacia & two natives went up to Cape Point for a sled load of Boat gear returned at dusk. Ther 36° Below zero ends these 24 hours.

Friday, March 8th 1867.

All this day heavy S. E. gales accompanied with snow 3 natives and a dog team went up to over fence and got one of their old whale boats. Ther 34° Below zero. So ends this day.

Saturday, March 9th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S. E. Ther 15° Below zero. So ends these 24 hours.

Sunday, March 10th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and calm. Ther before sunrise 32° Below at noon 12 above in the sun nearly all the natives went walrusing to day and 2 of the 1st mates one of the natives caught a seal and returned to the ship. Latter part fine and light N. W. winds. So ends this day.

Monday, March 11th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light N. W. winds Ther 32° Below zero. So ends this day.

Tuesday, March 12th 1867.

All this day heavy gales from the S. W. accompanied with thick snow storm. Ther 15° Below zero. So ends this day.

Living In Repulse Bay Greenland.
Wednesday, March 13th 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the S. E. and cloudy weather. Middle & latter part more moderate with fine pleasant weather. Capt & officers employed in rigging Boat Sails Ther 3 Above zero. So ends this day.

Thursday, March 14th 1867.

All this day cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the S. E. natives arrived from Beach Point having caught 3 Beers and one Seal. Ther 4° Below zero. So ends this day.

Friday, March 15th 1867.

All this day heavy gales from the S. E. accompanied with snow. Ther 15° Above zero. So ends this day.

Saturday, March 16th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S. W. all hands employed in taking away the Starboard Bank from the ship and getting the snow off the focastle. Ther 4° Above zero. Several natives went to the floe to day. So ends this day.

Sunday, March 17th 1867.

This day commenced with foggy weather and light westerly winds accompanied with snow. Middle and latter part fine pleasant weather and light westerly winds. Several natives arrived from the floe caught 2 seals. Ther at zero. So ends this day.

Monday, March 18th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from N. W. to S. E. all hands employed in cutting Bank away on the Port Side. Ther at 5 A.M. 24° Below zero. So ends this day.

Tuesday, March 19th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S. W. Ther 14° Below zero. crew employed in cutting out the Rudder and Stem & other necessary work. So ends this day. natives came from the floe bringing 3 seals.
