Wednesday March 20<sup>th</sup> 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light baffling winds crew employed in sledging casks from Shore playing Ball. &c. Ther at 1 am 18° Below zero. at noon in the Sun 26° Above zero ends this day.  
Thursday March 21<sup>st</sup> 1867.

First part of this 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S. E. Ther 23° Below zero. Middle Part fine crew employed in sledging off casks and playing Ball. &c. So ends this day.  
Friday March 22<sup>nd</sup> 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the S. E. with thick weather. 2<sup>nd</sup> mate & native 1 Boatman and Stewards started after a sled load of deer meat with a team of 17 dogs. Middle & Latter Part wind & weather the same. got off 2 loads of casks. So ends this day. 4° Below zero.  
Saturday March 23<sup>rd</sup> 1867.

This day commenced with strong gales from the S. E. accompanied with thick Snow Storm. Middle Part the same. Broke out flour. Latter Part strong westerly winds and fine pleasant weather. Ther 10° Above zero. So ends this day.  
Sunday March 24<sup>th</sup> 1867.

This day commenced with light breezes from the Southward and fine weather. Middle Part & Latter fine weather and light westerly winds natives returned from the floe with one Walrus. Ther 4° Below zero. So ends this day.  
Monday March 25<sup>th</sup> 1867.

Commenced with light airs from the Northward and fine pleasant weather. got off 2 loads of casks. Middle & Latter Part fine and pleasant calm weather. 2<sup>nd</sup> mate returned with a load of 13 deer & 60 lbs. Ther 14° Below zero. So ends this day.

Lying In. Repulse. Bay. Greenland.  
Tuesday March 26<sup>th</sup> 1867.

Commenced with light airs from the Northward and fine pleasant weather. Captains Baker Potter & Kilmer. have gone on a Musk Ox hunt with several natives. Middle Part fine weather and light westerly winds Broke out meat and finished sledging off casks. Latter Part fine and calm. Ther 20° Below zero. So ends this day.  
Wednesday March 27<sup>th</sup> 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light westerly winds. Middle Part fine and light N. W. winds brought one of our Boats from Shore. Latter Part fine weather and light airs from the Westward. Ther 4° Below zero. So ends this day.  
Thursday March 28<sup>th</sup> 1867.

All this day strong gales from the S. E. 3<sup>rd</sup> mate and cooper employed in washing out their State rooms. Broke out Molasses, &c. Ther 8° Below zero. So ends this day. (Native Bill died)  
Friday March 29<sup>th</sup> 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the S. E. and clear weather. Middle Part fine weather and fresh breezes from the S. E. crew employed in tearing off our winterhouse and sledging off our Boats. two of our natives went to the floe today. Latter Part cloudy weather and strong breeze from the S. E. Ther 10° Below zero. So ends this day.  
Saturday March 30<sup>th</sup> 1867.

Commenced with fresh gales from S. E. accompanied with thick Snow Storm. Middle Part more moderate got up tackles and Broke out the After hold. Latter Part strong gales from the S. E. accompanied with thick Snow Storm Ther 2° above zero. So ends this day.
