

Barque. Black. Engle. Edwin, W. White & Austin.
Friday April 12th 1867.

All this day fine weather and light winds from the N.W. with light falling snow. all hands employed in rigging the boats and other necessary work. Then at 5. nearly all the natives came from the floe to day. So ends this day.
Saturday. April 13th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from the N.W. Ther 12° Below 0. Middle Part. fine with strong breezes from the N.W. crew employed breaking out the run & fitting gear and boats for floe whaling. Saw a flock of 10 deer close to the ship. So ends this day.
Sunday April 14th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light airs from the West. Ther 10° Below zero. one of the native boys died to day. So ends this day.

Monday. April 15th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from the East. 2nd mate & mate of Glacier have gone deer hunting. all hands employed in stowing down meat. Latter Part fresh fells from the S.O. accompanied with snow. Ther 5° Below zero. So ends this day.

Tuesday. April 16th 1867.

This day commenced with fine weather & light winds from the North. Latter Part clear weather and strong breeze from the N.W. 6° Above 0. So ends this day.

Wednesday April 17th 1867.

This day fine weather & strong breezes from the N.W. employed in putting up provisions for whale hunt. Ther 12° Below zero. So ends this day.

Lying. In. Repulse. Bay. Greenland.
Thursday. April 18th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and fresh breezes from the N.W. 2nd mate arrived from deer hunting. But got none. Ther 18° Below zero. So ends this day.

Friday. April 19th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light westerly winds. Boatstems employed in making a tent for whale Point natives arrived from Sibsons Cove from deer hunting no deer. Ther 22° Below zero. So ends this day.

Saturday. April 20th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light airs from the North. employed in painting the boats and other necessary work about the ship. Mr. Craps and boy started for the floe edge with a boat at 1 Pm. Ther 20° Below 0. So ends this day.

Sunday. April 21st 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from the N.W. Ther 18° Below zero. So ends this day.

Monday. April 22nd 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light N.W. winds employed in stowing down casks and other necessary work. Mate arrived from the floe. reports the water 16 miles. Ther 20° Below 0. So ends this day.

Tuesday April 23rd 1867.

All this day light cloudy weather and light breezes from the South. employed in breaking out. Provisions and stowing down. Several of the natives went after walrus. Ther 21° Below zero. So ends this day.
