

Bark. Black. Eagle Edwin. W. White Master
Sunday May 5th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light breezes from the East. Captains Employed in getting observations and working them. So ends this 24 hours.
Monday May 6th 1867.

This day commenced with cloudy weather and light falling snow. Middle Port fine and pleasant with light northerly winds all hands employed in shifting and mending sail. Latter Part much the same. So ends this 24 hours.
Tuesday May 7th 1867.

First and middle Ports cloudy weather light winds from the S. E. Latter Part much the same. So ends this day.
Wednesday May 8th 1867.

All this day light cloudy weather and light breezes from the South. Captains White Baker & Patten started for the Shore to find out how far the nearest water was. crew employed in scraping. Bone finished at 8 P.m. Saw several Deer. So ends this day.

Thursday May 9th 1867.
This day finer pleasant weather and light cloudy weather wind light from the S. E. all hands employed in washing ship inside. So ends this day.

Friday May 10th 1867.
All this day fine pleasant weather and light winds from the S. E. all hands employed in washing the out side of the ship. The Captains arrived at 4 P.m. caught 2 deer but saw no water. So ends this day.

Saturday May 11th 1867.
All this day cloudy weather and light winds from the S. E. Cooper employed in shoeing a sled for the natives. So ends this day.

Lying In Repulse Bay Greenland.
Sunday May 12th 1867.

All this day fine weather and light northerly winds. So ends this day.
Monday May 13th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light baffling winds. all hands employed in taring down. Captains White and Patten started on a deer hunt with 4 natives. saw several deer to day. So ends this day.

Tuesday May 14th 1867.
All this day pleasant weather and strong breezes from the N. E. all hands employed in drying Sails and stowing down Bone. So ends this day.

Wednesday May 15th 1867.
All this day cloudy weather and strong breezes from N. E. with snow. So ends these twenty four hours.

Thursday May 16th 1867.
This day commenced with stormy weather and fresh breezes from the N. E. Middle Port much the same. most of the natives from Sealing arrived to day & reports another death of an old native woman. Latter Part cloudy and light airs from N. E. So ends this day.

Friday May 17th 1867.
This day light cloudy weather and light winds from N. E. Mr. White men of Repulse expedition arrived to night from Gibson's Cove having traveled 30 miles in the 24 hours. So ends this day. (with 3 deer)

Saturday May 18th 1867.
All this day fine pleasant weather and light airs from the North. Mr. Hall arrived some time last night. So ends this day.
