

Bark Black Eagle, Edwin W. White, Master.
Sunday May 19th 1867.

This day light cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N. N. W. 3rd mate & 1 man started on a fishing cruise 2nd mate went to Topie Point after dog meat. But got none.
So ends this day.

Monday, May 20. 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from N. Middle Port cloudy and fresh gales from N. natives started hunting but returned again. Latter Part more moderate light winds from N. and cloudy weather. So ends this day.

Tuesday May 21st 1867.

This day commenced with cloudy weather and fresh breezes from N. W. Middle Port strong breezes from the N. W. crew employed in mending paint and cleaning ship for painting. So ends this day.

Wednesday May 22nd 1867.

All this day light baffling winds and fine pleasant weather. Employed in scraping down the masts and wheel. Mate and 3rd mate returned and all the Boatsteerers relieved them. So ends this day.

Thursday May 23rd 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light winds from N. to S. E. all hands employed in painting ship inside and out finished. Leaving out side Boatsteerers returned at night. So ends this day. (2 of the Captains & Mr. Hall started on a muskox hunt at 10 P.m.)

Friday, May 24th 1867.

All this day light cloudy weather and light winds from the Southward. So ends this day.

Saturday May 25th 1867.

All this day light cloudy weather and light southerly winds all hands employed in painting ship. mate started for the Beach Point one of the men shot a grouse. So ends this day.

Sunday, May 25th 1867.

This day cloudy weather & light N. E. winds. Tom & Blucher returned with 4 deer. So ends this day.

Monday May 26th 1867.

This day cloudy weather and light Easterly winds the mates returned from Beach Point at 6 Am. reporting no water in sight from there Broke out kolasses and got a load of Ice. 2nd mate preparing to go on a deer hunt. So ends these 24 hours.

Tuesday, May 28th 1867.

This day commenced with light winds from the N. E. 2nd mate and 2 natives started on a deer hunt. finished painting ship and washed all the bear skins. ends with S. W. winds and cloudy weather.

Wednesday May 29th 1867.

All this day moderate gale from the N. W. got 2 casks of water on the Rocks. So ends this day.

Thursday May 30th 1867.

All this day cloudy weather and strong N. W. gales. So ends this day.

Friday May 31st 1867.

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the N. W. with thick snow storm. Middle Port more moderate broke out shops. 2nd mate arrived with 4 deer. Latter Part light N. E. winds with some rain natives moving toqike on shore. So ends this day.
