

Borgue Black. Eagles Edwin W. White. Kasten.
Saturday June 1st 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light N E winds all hands employed in Sledging off fresh Water. Captains White and Potten started for the Floe Edge. Captains Killmar and Baker returned from hunting muskox. Shot 2. White and Potten arrived from floe 14 miles off. report a little water. So ends this day.

Sunday June 2nd 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and Strong breezes from the N.W. all hands employed in getting Boats ready for Whale Point. our natives arrived with 2 deer. So ends this day.

Monday June 3rd 1867.

This day cloudy weather and fresh breezes from the N. E. N. E. and 3rd mate started for whale Point with their boats at 5 am. one Boat crew on Board. run 120 lbs salt water into the Ground Tier. So ends this day.

Tuesday June 4th 1867.

All this day fine weather and light winds from N E to N. Employed in restoring the Holds. and running down Water. Broke out Cask Bread and Molasses sold 530 lbs. Bread to S. Cornelia. So ends this day.

Wednesday June 5th 1867.

All this day fine weather and light Westerly winds. crew employed in drying and Stowing down Bone repaired the Ice Sleds. one of the Boatsteerers shot a deer So ends these twenty four hours.

Thursday June 6th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light winds from N.W. much water making in the Harbor seized the Land to the main Rigging. another very old native supposed about 80 years old (Old Kimo) end fine 40 Grosbeaks ^{shot} day

Friday June 7th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light S. Winds. 2nd mate started for Beach Point to carry Coal & Molasses. to the mate. arrived at 7 P.M. left the Ship at 1.20 P.M. So ends this day.

Saturday June 8th 1867.

This day overcast weather and high winds from S.W. to W. got off 2 casks of water. So ends this day.

Sunday June 9th 1867.

This day thick Snow Storm all day. 2nd mate arrived from Beach Point. reports very little water. ends this day with strong S. E. winds.

Monday June 10th 1867.

This day commenced with Strong breezes from the N. much snow fell during yesterday. employed in getting ready for whaling at Kalls Island. sledged the Starboard and West Boats out side of the Shore Ice. natives returned from hunting with 4 deer. So ends this day.

Tuesday June 11th 1867.

All this day fine weather and Strong Breezes from the N. Boats out Bay & Park & Molasses. Captain & all the Ships natives started for Kalls Island with provisions for one month for 2 Boats crews. So ends this day.

Wednesday June 12th 1867.

This day cloudy weather and light winds from North. started the Star Pump for the first time this year very little water in the Hold. So ends this day.

Thursday June 13th 1867.

This day day fine weather & Strong breezes from the N.W. N. E. all hands employed in getting the remaining 3 Boats ready for the Floe whaling. Captain arrived from the Kalls Island at 1 P.M. all hands to start at 4 am tomorrow ends
