

Barber - Black Eagle. Edwin, W. White. Master.
Friday June 14th 1867.

This day commenced with cloudy weather and light winds from the N. E. Capt & 2^d mate started for whole Halls Islands with 18 men & 3 boats. Middle & latter Part fine pleasant weather & light N. W. winds arrived at the Island at 2 P.M. very little water in sight from the Islands. the natives are catching large quantities of Seal at the present time. So ends this day. (No cases of scurvy at the present time)
Saturday June 15th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light S. E. winds. all hands on the Islands fitting up the house. very little water in sight from Halls Islands. plenty of Seal.
So ends this day.
Sunday June 16th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather & light N. E. winds. Middle Part cloudy & snow. Latter Part. thick fog & light S. E. winds fitted Sled for native on So ends.
Monday June 17th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather & light winds from the N. W. very little water in sight. fitted another Sled for the natives
So ends this twenty four hours.
Tuesday June 18th 1867.

Commenced with fine weather and light N. W. winds. Middle Part fine & light S. W. winds Cooper shot a wild goose. Latter Part rainy weather & light westerly winds natives Bills squaw died at 6 P.M. So ends this day.
Wednesday June 19th 1867.

This day commenced with thick, Snow Storm & Strong breeze from the N. E. 2^d mate shot 2 wild geese. Latter Part fine weather & Strong N. W. winds ice set off a little natives came in this evening with 12 deer. So ends this day.

Lying In. Repulse Bay Greenland.
Thursday June 20th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather & light westerly winds. 2^d mate & Cooper started with 2 boats & 12 men for a Point of Land 4 miles below Halls Islands. So ends this day.
Friday June 21st 1867.

All this day fine weather & light winds from S. W. to S. E. Ice closed in solid again to day. 2^d mate shot a lot of Big ducks.
So ends this day.
Saturday June 22^d 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather & light S. E. winds no water in sight.
Sunday June 23^d 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather and light N. W. winds Ice set off a little to day.
Monday June 24th 1867.

This day fine pleasant weather & light Southerly winds. very little water to day natives shot plenty of Seal So ends this day.
Tuesday June 25th 1867.

This day commenced with light Southerly winds & cloudy weather. 2^d mate went deer hunting shot one deer. Captain came down with more provisions from Halls Island. Latter Part rainy weather & S. E. winds Capt returned to Halls Island. So ends this day.
Wednesday June 26th 1867.

All this day rainy weather and light winds from S. E. to N. W. So ends this day.
Thursday June 27th 1867.

This day Strong breeze from N. E. with rain. Ice set well off but no whales.
Friday June 28th 1867.

This day commenced with thick, rainy weather & light S. E. winds. Middle & latter Parts fine & light winds from N. W.
