

Barge Black Eagle Edwin W. White Master
Tuesday July 16th 1867.

All this day fine weather and
light winds from the East end very little water.
So ends these twenty four hours.

Wednesday July 17th 1867.

This day light Easterly
winds & pleasant weather, no water in sight from
Hall's Islands. So ends this day.

Thursday July 18th 1867.

This day commenced with
light Easterly winds Middle Part Strong Easterly
winds & much rain.

Friday July 19th 1867.

This day cloudy weather & light
baffling winds. So ends this day.

Saturday July 20th 1867.

This day fine weather & light
variable winds very little water in sight. Ends
with light fog.

Sunday July 21st 1867.

This day light fog & light
N.E. winds. Saw 1 Bay head & chased him
going quick to the S.E. but did not strike him.
also saw plenty of white whales very little water.
So day & heavy pack on. So ends this day.

Monday July 22nd 1867.

This day fine weather & light buff
winds no water heavy pack on. So ends this day.

Tuesday July 23rd 1867.

This day light N.E. winds & fine
pleasant weather, no water in sight. The sailors got
a lot of ducks eggs to day. So ends this day.

Wednesday July 24th 1867.

All this day fine weather
and strong breezes from the N.W. ice breaking up
in Howland Bay. Saw a large Steamer Bound
up to where the Ships were lying. So ends this day.

Lying in Repulse Bay Greenland
Thursday July 25th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant
weather & strong breezes from the N.W. at 6 A.M. 2nd mate
& Cooper started for Loopick Point 9 1/4 hours pulling
over the Bay. So ends this day.

Friday July 26th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant
weather & strong N. Wester 2nd mate went on board
& got letters from the Steamer which proved to
be the Nimrod of St. Johns. having on board
crew of the Steamer Pioneer which was sunk in
the ice on July 5th. So ends this day.

Saturday July 27th 1867.

All this day dark cloudy weather
& light winds from the N.W. & N.E. 2nd mate returned
to Loopick Point. to cruise for whales. Capt White
shipped Mr. Daniel Webster Kate 1st Officer of Steamer
Pioneer, and 7 men 6 of them are to "hunt" on shore
with the crew & the other 2 are Passengers. So ends this day.

Sunday July 28th 1867.

This day strong breezes from N.
& dark cloudy weather. Capt White & Mr. Webster
came on shore to whale. Saw nothing today.

Monday July 29th 1867.

This day commenced with
light winds from N. all 6 boats cruising for
whales. Middle & Latter Parts much the same.
Captain & Cooper went to Potters Point with
their boats & crews. Saw plenty of white whale.
So ends this day.

Tuesday July 30th 1867.

Strong breezes from N. This day commenced with
the N.W. with fine weather 2nd mate
& Mr. Webster went to Potters Point to look for seals.
Middle Part fine & light Southerly winds all the
3rd mate came from the South for instructions
had seen no Whales and no chance as yet to get
to Whale Point. ends with rain and fresh N.W. winds.
