Wednesday July 31st 1867.

All this day fine weather & strong breezes from N. W. Saw 1 whale and the Officer got him. So ends this day.

Thursday Aug 1st 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light baffling winds. All Boats cruising for whales. So ends this day.

Friday Aug 2nd 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather & light southerly winds. Saw one whale all the Boats returned to the Ship. Hove up the Port Anchor. Saw a large English Bergue & trader & whaler. the Ocean Nymph of London. 3rd mate got off 2 casks of water. So ends this day.

Saturday Aug 3rd 1867.

This day commenced with cloudy weather & fresh breezes from the S. E. 4 boats went on shore to look for whales. Middle & Latter Part. heavy gales from the S. E. all the boats returned on board. Capt. let go 2nd anchor. the Ocean Nymph came in & anchored.

Sunday Aug 4th 1867.

All this day thick rainy weather & light N. E. winds. Hove up the 2nd anchor. boats went off to cruise for whales but saw none returned at night. So ends this day.

Monday Aug 5th 1867.

All this day dark cloudy weather and light westerly winds. Hove the Anchor up at 11 A.M. and towed Ship out of 8 fathoms in 100 with snail Gibbs & Combulia. Capt. White gave the natives a boat. came down as far as Goldsch Point & hove Ship too for the night. Saw 3 bowheads. So ends this day.

Cruising. In. Hudsons Bay. Greenland
All Tues Aug 6th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather & light westerly winds. Ship bound down the welcome. Saw plenty of walrus. sent the 3rd mate into the mouth of Inger River for his line. Latter Part light westerly winds and hazy weather. Hove Ship too at 7 1/2 P.M. So ends this day.

Wednesday Aug 7th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather & light variable winds. Ship all working. Only took the mate on board 20 miles N. of Whale Point had seen but one whale the Spring Mr. Fisher of the Gibbs came on board a little while very little ice in sight. So ends this day.

Thursday Aug 8th 1867.

This day commenced with light easterly winds. Ship Bound for Marble Islands. Middle & Latter Part. Blowing heavy from N. E. ran the Ship until 3 P.M. hove her too under close reef main topsail & reef fore sail. much rain. This day So ends this day.

Friday Aug 9th 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the N. E. and dark cloudy weather. Middle & Latter Part fine pleasant weather & light westerly winds sent 3 boats into Marble Island returned again at 5 P.M. Capt. Killmer & White went on shore and found a letter from Capt. Parker of Bergue Oray Capt. stating she had wintered with 250 bbls oil and got out of winter quarters 18th of June. ends fine Ship lying off & on all night. So ends this day.
