

Bark Black Eagle Edwin W. White. Master
Saturday Aug 10th 1867

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather & calm. Capt & 3rd mate went on shore at N.E. end of Marble Island to look for whales. Saw nothing. Middle & Latter Part light N.E. winds and, rainy weather & thick fog. Ship lying off & on N. Island. So ends this day.
Sunday Aug 11th 1867.

All this day dark cloudy weather and light westerly winds. Ship bound up the welcome two sail in sight. Broke out. So ends this day.

Monday Aug 12th 1867.

This day strong breezes from the N.W. Ship by the wind bound up the welcome. Saw several sail. At sundown took in the light sail.
Tuesday Aug 13th 1867.

This day fine weather & light breezes from the N.W. Saw 1 sail at 3 P.M. raised Cape Hullerton. Shortened sail at dark. So ends this day.
Wednesday Aug 14th 1867.

All this day light & rather windy and fine pleasant weather. Ship off & on at Yellow Bluff. 3rd mate & Mr. Webster went on shore to look for whales. saw none. Saw plenty of deer & Geese returned again at noon. So ends this day.
Thursday Aug 15th 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the N.W. Middle & Latter Part much the same. Ship off & on at Whale Point under easy sail. So ends this twenty four hours.
Friday Aug 16th 1867.

All this day fine pleasant weather and light N.W. winds. Ship off & on at Yellow Bluff. 3rd mate & Mr. Webster went on shore to look for whales. saw none. Saw plenty of deer & Geese returned again at noon. So ends this day.

Cruising In Hudsons Bay for Whales.
Saturday Aug 17th 1867.

This day commenced with light N.W. winds. Mate & 3rd mate went on shore at Yellow Bluff to look for whales. Middle Part fine pleasant weather & strong S.W. winds. Ship by the wind. Land with the Oray Taff & Glacier. Capt Parker took two of the wrecked men. Boats returned off 4. P.M. Saw one small whale going South quick. Latter Part strong S.W. winds took in the light sails & double reefed the topsails. So ends these 24 hours.

Sunday Aug 18th 1867.

All this day strong breezes from S.W. Ship standing off & on the land. made sail at daylight. Saw 2 sail. So ends this day.
Monday Aug 19th 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from the S.W. made all sail at daylight. Saw the land. Middle Part fine weather & fresh breezes from S.W. Saw the Glacier. Lills. O. Taff. O. Taff. & Steamer Nimrod at 2. P.M. Ship off & on at Whale Point. distant 8 miles. Latter Part strong breezes from N.W. took in the light sails at dark. Saw one small whale at 7 P.M. Glacier came very near striking. So ends this day.

Tuesday Aug 20th 1867.

All this day strong breezes from N.W. to N.W. Ship by the wind under easy sail. 3 sail in lee. Middle Part wind & weather the same. 3 sail in lee. Saw Depot Island bearing North. dist 10 miles. Latter Part fine pleasant weather & strong breezes from the N.W. double reefed the topsails at dark. Ship by the winds. So ends this day.

Wednesday Aug 21st 1867.

& Middle Part strong. All this day fine weather. first breezes from the N.W. Ship off & on at Depot Island. at 3 P.M. raised. Marble Isle made all sail. Saw G. & O. Taff. Latter Part fine & light winds from N.W. steering N.W. for N. Island. ends with calm.
