

Barge. Black Eagle. Edwin W. White, Master
Sunday Sept 8th 1867.

This day commenced with cloudy rainy weather and fresh breezes from the N.W. steering S.S.W. under all drawing sail. Middle Part fine pleasant weather & strong breezes from N.W. steering S.S.W. saw a large Bark at 9 am Bound East. saw a number of large Ice Bergs. Latter Part fine pleasant weather and strong breezes from the N.W. steering S.S.W. at 8 Pm took in Main Royal. at 10. took in Main Top. Lat 52° 49' N. gallant sail & fore sail. So ends this day Long 51° 42' W.
Monday, Sept 9th 1867.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather & light winds from N.W. made all sail at daylight. Middle Part fine weather and light airs steering S.S.W. Latter Part fine weather & light westerly winds. Ship close hauled. So ends this day
Lat 47° 41' N.
Long 50° 23' W.

Tuesday, Sept 10th 1867.

This day commenced with fine weather and light winds from the W.S.W. Ship by the winds. Middle Part fine with light clouds and light winds from W.S.W. Ship close hauled. Saw several fin Backs. Latter Part fine pleasant weather and light breezes from W.S.W. ship by the wind. Lat 48° 31' N.
So ends this 24 hours Long 48° 36' W.

Wednesday, Sept 11th 1867.

This day commenced with strong breezes from S.W. ship by the winds set the main top gallant sail. Middle Part cloudy & strong breezes from S.W. Saw a large ship bound to the Eastward. Double reefed the topsails & furled the main sail. Ship too under close reef main topsail and fore sail much heavy rain. So ends this day.

Bound. Towards New Bedford Mass.
Thursday Sept 12th

This day commenced with cloudy weather wind hauled to N.E. steering S.W. by the wind made all drawing sail. Saw a Brig bound to the Eastward. Middle Part dark cloudy weather & light winds from the N.E. steering W. under all sail saw plenty of ships all Bound to the Eastward. Latter Part hazy weather & light N.E. winds steering W. So ends this day Lat 46° 18' N.
Friday, Sept 13th 1867.

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winds steering W. This day commenced with light weather sounded in 38 fathoms water. Middle Part fine weather and light baffling winds. Latter Part dark cloudy weather and light baffling winds steering Lat 45° 23' N. W. by N. under all sail. Saw a large English Long 49° 26' N. Ship bound Towards England. So ends this day.
Saturday, Sept 14th 1867.

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the Westward ship by the winds. Saw 1 sail bound to the Westward. Middle Part fine pleasant weather and strong S.W. winds. Ship by the winds at 2 Pm. took in the Royals at 3. took in Toppell sails flying. Ship & Capt. Top sail saw several sail bound E. Latter Part equally weather at 10. Pm wind died out and came out N.W. and strong breezes double reefed the fore topsail. So ends this day. Lat 45° 24' N.
Sunday, Sept 15th 1867. Long 51° 40' W.

This day commenced with double reef topsail breezes from N.W. steering W. double reefed main topsail took in spanker and fore sail. Middle Part more moderate turned out reef and set spanker and fore sail saw one sail. Latter Part fine pleasant weather and light breezes from the Northward, steering West made all sail. So ends this day
Lat 44° 35' N.
Long 54° 29' W.
