

Towards the Western Islands
Saturday July 1st

These 24 hours commences with Calms and foggy weather at 7 AM the wind came out to the NW took in topgallant sail flying jib and gaff topsail Wind hauling to the Northward Latter part made more westerly steering ESE So Ends this Day men Employed in boiling out the blubber of the Blackfish
 Lat by Acco 41° 30' N
 Lon by Acco 48° 40' West

Sunday July 2nd

First part of these 24 hours fresh winds from the NW and cloudy weather steering to the Eastward Middle and Latter parts light air from all parts of the compass and Calm three sail in sight at 6 PM finished boiling out the Blackfish So Ends this Day Calm
 Lat Account 41° 25' North
 Lon by Account 45° 53' West

Monday July 3rd

First part of these 24 hours Calm three sail in sight one of them a fore topmast sloop Middle part light air from the ESE heading NW Latter part fine breeze from the SW steering ESE at 10 AM a English brig bore a back a head down town to speak him & stand got a foul of him through a mistake carried away flying jib boom and jib boom and all of the head gear lost the head one fluke of the Larboard Anchor and stove the waste boat besides sundry other damages the brig was the Mary Ann of Sunderland the Tarneg bore to him was small So Ends this Day one sail standing to North and West Lat Obs 42° 27'
 Lon 45° 00'

Tuesday July 4th

All these 24 hours fine breeze from the Westward steering SE by E by at times with fine rain men variously Employed in repairing Tarnegs Cooper Employed in making a new fligib room So Ends this Day Lat Obs 41° 58'
 Lon 43° 00' West

Wednesday July 5th

These 24 hours commences with fine rain and foggy weather Middle part Cloudy Latter part fine weather with light winds from the SW one fine back whale in sight one a sail So Ends men variously Employed
 Lat Obs 41° 13' N
 Lon by Chron 38° 38' West

Thursday July 6th

All these 24 hours light winds from the SW and foggy weather nothing in sight So Ends this Day men Employed in Ships Duty Lat Obs 40° 39' N
 Lon by Chron 37° 41'

Friday July 7th

All these 24 hours light winds from the SW and foggy weather steering SE by E saw two hump back Whales So Ends this Day
 Lat Obs 40° 24'
 Lon by Chron 36° 17' West

Saturday July 8th

All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and Calm saw a number of porpoises men variously Employed So Ends this Day
 Lat Obs 40° 38' N
