steering S by W Cooper turning provisions
Carpenter repairing the Waste boat

Duty So Ends this Day Lat 28° 31'
Lon by Chron 26° 45' West

Tuesday July Aug 1st
All these 24 hours pleasant NW E
trade winds steering S by W with
all sail set to the best advantage
Saw nothing this Day So Ends
Men Employed in Ships Duty
Lat 26° 49' North

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from
the NW steering S by W Men
variously Employed in Ships Duty
Carpenter Employed in repairing
the Waste boat Cooper making
breakers So Ends nothing in
sight this Day

steering S by W Men variously Employed
in Ships Duty Carpenter Employed
in making a hopper So Ends this

Lat 0° 18' 57" North
Lon by Chron 26° 28' West

Saturday Aug 5th
All these 24 hours moderate NW E trades
steering to the South Saw one sail in
the SE men variously Employed
in Ships Duty So Ends this Day
Lat 0° 17' 04"
Lon by Chron 26° 53' West

Sunday August 6th
First part of the 24 hours moderate
winds from the North steering South
Middle part Calm latter part baffling
winds from NW to E with passing
clouds So Ends this Day Nothing
in sight Lat 0° 15' 32" W
Lon by Chron 26° 32'

Monday August 7th
These 24 hours commences with light wind
and baffling blowing to the South latter
part winds from the Northward with
passing clouds Nothing in sight this
Day men Employed in Ships
Duty So Ends Lat 0° 13' 55" W
Lon by Chron 26° 16' W
