At 5 o'clock Rose two rite Whales
Did not lower they were going
quick to the windward so ends
this Day saw a Great many
Fin Back Whales Latt 03 44. 26
Lon by Account 125. 20 East

Wednesday Jan^y 3rd
The 24 hours Commences with Pleasant
Breezes from the Westward steering to the
Eastward at 11 AM saw two white Whales
Lowered for them got fast Drawed from
One turned the other up and took him
A long side at 4 PM Commenced
Cutting at 6 PM got through the
Arm of Sag Harbor cutting at the
same time at night took in
sails at 4 o'clock kept on to the
Eastward middle part rainey
thick weather Winds N.W. W
Latter part moderate winds
and smoky weather saw several
Fin Backs at 10 o'clock Commenced
Drying out the Whales so ends
Latt 03 44. 31 South

Thursday Jan^y 4th
First part of this Day low clouds thick
Weather middle part rainey with a
thick fog Winds N.W. Latter part
Pleasant Weather with light Winds
from the N.W. saw one Fin
Back Whale but no White so
ends this Day got through
Boiling out the Whales at
8 A.M. Latt 03 44. 17
Lon by Chr 128. 44

Friday Jan^y 5th
First part of this Day light air from the
N.W. and Pleasant Weather steering to
the Eastward middle part light winds
from the Southward and Pleasant latter
part Wind from the S.E. employed in
stowing Towing oil and cleaning some
At 11 AM Rose a White Whale
and lowered for him so ends this
Day Pleasant smooth weather
No Obs this Day

Saturday Jan^y 6th
First part of this Day Pleasant Weather winds
from the S.E. at 7 PM took a White
Whale along side at 8 PM Commenced
cutting at 9 PM got through and
doubled Reaped the topsails middle
part Winds from the N.E. at 10 PM
started the work latter part strong
Winds from the N.W. took in
the fore topsails so ends this Day
employed in trying out the Whales
Latt 03 44. 49 South

Sunday Jan^y 7th
First part of this Day strong winds
from the N.W. and heavy rain
middle and latter parts thick
rainey weather at 5 PM the
Wind shifted to the Southward
employed in drying out the
Whales saw no Whales this Day
No Obs Latt 03 45. 01 East
Lon by Chron 132. 05 East

Monday Jan^y 8th
First part of this Day strong winds
from the S.W. steering to the Eastward
middle part moderate latter part
light Winds from the S.W. with rain
squalls saw no Whales this Day
employed in stowing Towing
oil in the main hatch so ends
this Day Latt 03 45. 12 South
