First Part of this Day light air from the Northward at 4 PM saw Carline island bearing NW Dist 40 miles at 7 PM had a heavy squall from the East with rain at 10 PM tacked ship to the Eastward at 2 PM tacked ship to the NW latter Part light air and calm close in with the land so Ends this Day

Monday March 18th
First Part of this Day light air from the Northward steering to the Leeward of Carline island middle Part calm latter Part light air from the South and East steering to the NW so Ends this Day

First Part of this Day light wind from the East steering on NW wind to the NW & middle Part light air from the Northward latter Part light air from the NW so Ends this Day men employed in Ship's Duty Blacksmithing Carpentering and so fourth Latt Obs 8^h 45 South

Wednesday March 20th
All these 24 hours light air from the Northward and calm that of the time with fine rain squalls saw nothing this Day employed in Blacksmithing and Carpentering and other necessary work so Ends this Day No Obs

Thursday March 21st
All these 24 hours as usual light air from the Northward with calms with blow and then a squall of rain variegated employed in Ship's Duty nothing in sight but small fish so Ends this Day calm
