Saturday March 26th
All these 24 hours light air from
the Northward and Eastward heading
from North to West. Saw
Nothing this Day So End

Late Obs 7th 08 South
Lon by Chron 152nd 17 West

Sunday March 27th
All these 24 hours light Breezes from
the N.E. to S.E. heading from North
to West. Nothing in Sight this Day
So End Late Obs 5th 56 South
Lon by Chron 152nd 17 West

Monday March 28th
All these 24 hours light winds from
the S.E. and Pleasant Weather
steering on at Wind to the Northward
at Meriden Rose at School of
Sperm Whale and lowered all
three Boats So End this Day
Late Obs

Tuesday March 29th
All these 24 hours steady winds from
the S.E. at 4 P.M. the Boats came
On Board did not get fast and
two parts at them and they went
to the windward men employed
in Ship's Duty So End
Late Obs 2nd 45 South
Lon by Chron 153rd 07

Wednesday March 30th
These 24 hours Wind from the
S.E. to East heading from North
to West. Saw 2 Whales this
Day men employed in Ship's
Duty So End. Strong Waddy Current
Late Obs 00th 40 South
Lon by Chron 153rd 35 West

Round to the Northward

Thursday March 31st
These 24 hours Commences with Breeze
from the East steering on at
wind to the Northward middle and
latter parts light air from East to
S.E. and passing clouds. Saw 2 Whales
this Day. A strong Waddy Current
setting to the Westward men variously
employed in Ship's Duty So End
Late Obs 00th 58 North
Lon by Chron 153rd 34 West

Friday March 31st
All these 24 hours light winds from
the S.E. steering on at Wind to
the Northward at Long South heading
from the Northward Saw Nothing
this Day men employed in Ship's
Duty So End this Day
Late Obs 1st 53 North
Lon by Chron 153rd 36 West

Saturday March 30th
First part of this Day light wind
from the S.E. steering on at
Wind to the Northward middle
and latter parts squalls of rain and
wind from S.E. to S.W.
The squalls were very fine and
Whales seen variously So End
this Day Late Obs 3rd 40 S.
Lon by Chron 153rd 35

Sunday March 31st
All these 24 hours heavy squalls of rain
and wind from the S.E. to S.W.
Bent at a new forecast. Barred a way
the flying jib boom cleared away
the gear and got it on Deck So End
this Day rainey squalls weather
took in and made full as occasion
required No Observation
