

Bound to the N.W. Coast

Monday April 15th

At 10 AM these 24 hours strong E & S trade winds leading NW at 3 PM saw the Island called Bird Island under Double Reefed Topsails took in the main sail and jib and spanked in squalls blowing and raining in heavy squalls at 10 PM passed the Island to windward about 5 miles men employed in repairing the fore topsail to 10 PM this evening Lat 23° 45' North Lon By Chron 167° 38' West

Tuesday April 16th

At 10 AM these 24 hours strong E & S trade winds under Double Reefed Topsails the first part of the day later that the topsails were employed in repairing the fore topsail to 10 PM this day nothing in sight Lat 25° 11' North Lon By Chron 168° 30' West

Wednesday April 17th

These 24 hours commences with strong E & S trade winds at 2 PM took in topgallant sails middle and latter part light winds with squalls of fine rain leading from NW to WNW Lat after 10 PM men employed in ship duty setting up the lead chimes and so forth to 10 PM this day nothing in sight Lat 26° 15' North Lon By Chron 169° 10' West

Thursday April 18th

At 10 AM these 24 hours light airs and calm from the North and East at 8 AM tacked to the E & S and went the main topsail to repair it. So ended this day nothing in sight Lat 26° 53' North Lon By Chronometer 165° 03' West

Thursday April 18th

At 10 AM these 24 hours light airs and calm from the North and East at 8 AM tacked to the E & S and went the main topsail to repair it. So ended this day nothing in sight Lat 26° 53' North Lon By Chronometer 165° 03' West

Friday April 19th

At 10 AM these 24 hours light airs from the Northward and calm leading different ways saw a school of Killers but no Whales men employed in sitting up the lead chimes and so forth to 10 PM this day Lat 27° 18' North Lon By Chron 165° 08' West

Saturday April 20th

First part of this day calm with clouds then light breeze from the water from different points of the compass middle part light winds from E & S latter part wind from the Eastward took in the topsails men employed in sitting up the lead chimes and repairing the boats and other necessary work saw nothing this day So ended this day Lat 27° 38' North Lon By Chron 164° 50' West

Sunday April 21th

First part of this day light winds from the Eastward men employed in ship duty painting the boats and so forth saw one fin back Whale middle part light winds from E & S and pleasant weather latter part wind from the Southward steering N by E with all sail set to the best advantage So ended this day Lat 28° 35' North Lon By Chron 164° 08' West
