

Bound to the Northward

Sunday Apr 28th
First Part of this Day Strong gales from the SE and thick weather with fine rain middle Part light baffling winds and heavy rain latter Part light air from the SE steering North So ended this Day Nothing in sight

Lat 40° 04' North
Lon by Chron 158° 41' West

Monday Apr 29th
First and middle Parts Calm latter Part winds from the Northward leading to the Northward Westward on Bent the mainsail to repair saw one fin back whale so ended this Day Lat 40° 30' N
Lon by Chron 158° 30' West

Tuesday Apr 30th
First Part of this Day winds from the Northward leading to the NW middle and latter Parts winds N & Nothing in sight this Day but birds so ended got the main sail repaired and bent it
Lat 41° 58' N
Lon by Chron 160° 19'

Wednesday May 1st
First Part of this Day light winds from E & S at 3 PM rose a white whale lowen all three boats got fast turned him up and sunk him lost 4 irons ore lance and 30 fathoms of line came on board at 6 PM took up the boats saw a whale of the Lee quarter but did not lower for him being too clear sight middle Part Calm latter Part light winds from NW so ended saw several grampus
Lat 42° 36' N Lon by Chron 159° 56'

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Thursday May 2nd
First Part of this Day light winds from the NW middle Part Calm latter Part light winds from the South with a heavy swell leaving from the SW set the Studding sails steering North by Compass so ended this Day Nothing in sight Lat 43° 08' N
Lon by Chron 159° 21' West

Friday May 3rd
First part of this Day light winds from the Northward steering North by Compass middle Part Strong winds from the SE took in topgallant studding sails and lower studding sails latter Part Strong winds from NW and heavy weather took in topmast studding sail flying jib and gaff top sail so ended this Day No whale in sight Lat 45° 15' N
Lon by Chron 158° 03' West

Saturday May 4th
All these 24 hours Strong winds from the Northward and a heavy swell leaving from the same quarter at 6 PM took in topgallant sails at 9 PM doubled reefed the top sails steering to the North by Compass so ended this Day Nothing in sight
Lat 47° 20' North
Lon by Chron 157° 03' West

Sunday May 5th
First Part of this Day light winds from the NW and latter Part Calm with a heavy swell leaving from the NW steering North by Compass so ended these 24 hours
Lat 47° 46' North
Lon by Chron 156° 43' West
