Tuesday May 28th

First Part of this Day Strong wind from the Southward with squalls of rain at 2 P.M. Got through cutting in the whale middle and latter parts more moderate at 9 A.M. were hauled to the ship. Men employed in clearing away the head hauling and further to land this Day
Lat 55° 55' North
Lon 152° 23'

Wednesday May 29th

First and middle parts of this Day Strong wind from the NW and thick weather leading to the South and East under short sail latter part moderate at 10 A.M. were hauled to the ship and set the fore topsail and hauled whales in sight employed in boiling through the 24 hours one ship in sight so banded this Day
Lat 55° 30' North

Thursday May 30th

First Part of this Day light wind from the Northward at 1 P.M. lowered all three boats got fast and started struck him again hauled out the line fastened again hauled and took the third line at 6 P.M. turned him up and got the lines at 10 P.M. got him to the ship being calm middle part calm at 2 P.M. commenced cutting the whale latter part light wind from the Eastward so banded this Day employed in cutting in one ship in sight plenty of whales in sight all the time
Lat 55° 30' North

Cruising for Whales on Friday May 31st

These 24 hours commenced with light wind from the Eastward at 2 P.M. got the whale cut in and cleared away the head and pin middle and latter parts strong gales from the Eastward close reefed the main top sail and took in the foresail one ship in sight several whales in sight this Day men employed in boiling and storing down oil in the after hole so banded this Day (16th lbs)

Saturday June 1st

First and middle parts Strong wind from the Eastward employed in boiling and storing down oil in the after hole at 4 P.M. got through storing down latter part moderate at 11 A.M. lowered for a whale got fast the whale hauled and took the line so banded this Day boiling two boats of chasing the whale with the line to him
No Oil this Day

Sunday June 2nd

These 24 hours commenced with light wind from the Eastward and heavy sea at 2 P.M. the boats came on board the whale and with one line at 5 P.M. lowered but did not get fast middle part calm latter part light wind from the Westward men employed in boiling and clearing fore and afting over line of two ships in sight at 11 A.M. got through boiling two whales in sight so banded
Lat 55° 42' North
Lon 154° 00'

Monday May 3rd

First Part of this Day Strong wind from the Westward lowered several lines for white whales two ships in sight at 4 P.M. commenced breaking out after hole and storing down sail steering of to the Eastward saw a great many humpback whales
Lat 55° 17' N Lon 152° 39' West
