

Whale Ground L. H. C. 1844
Tuesday June 11th

First Part of this Day Strong Westerly winds and thick weather at 4 P.M. got through cutting in the whale and cleared away the head and fin and commenced boiling middle and latter parts thick fog and Westerly winds at 7 P.M. commenced breaking out the fore hole and stowing down oil so ended this Day boiling and stowing down No. 11 this Day

Wednesday June 12th

First Part of this Day Strong winds from the NW and foggy weather employed in stowing down oil and boiling middle part strong winds and clear latter part the same employed in boiling and stowing down oil so ended this Day one ship in sight blowing fresh from the Westward

Long By Chron 151° 20 West

Thursday June 13th

Thue 24 hours commences with fresh gales from the Westward and hazy weather employed in stowing down and boiling oil at 3 P.M. the cold oil down middle part strong winds latter part the same with thick hazy weather employed in boiling so ended this Day No Whales in sight

Friday June 14th

First Part of this Day thick fog at 6 P.M. got through boiling middle part light winds and thick latter part the same at 5 P.M. got through commenced breaking out and stowing down oil so ended this Day stowing in the fore hole Lat 56° 08' N Long 151° 43'

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Whale Ground L. H. C. 1844
Saturday June 15th

First and middle parts of these 24 hours light winds and foggy weather employed in stowing down oil in the fore hole at 4 P.M. got through stowing forward and lowered twice for whale but did not get fast latter part light air and clear weather thus we got fast to a whale there one fore and one last the whale checked off the main hatch with oil two ships in sight one at boiling so ended this Day No Whales No. 11

Sunday June 16th

First Part of this Day calm and foggy weather and light winds from the NE and thick latter strong winds and fog saw two ships one at boiling lowered several times for whales but did not get fast so ended this Day No. 11

Monday June 17th

First Part of this Day fresh winds and foggy weather lowered several times for whales but did not get fast middle part the same thick fog latter part winds clear and moderate with fresh of fog the harbor quarter boat went on to a whale and got stuck but did not get fast at 11 P.M. took her a long side and took her on deck and put out the latter boat one ship in sight Cooper employed in setting up hooks for fresh water Carpenter employed in mending stowage boats the rest employed in blanning bone and so forth so ended this Day two Whales in sight

No. 11 this Day
