

Laying in Berkeley Sound Falkling Island  
Friday Jan 10<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day strong gale from  
the Westward and squally middle  
part calm latter part light winds  
from the Eastward got a raft of  
wood from the tower so ends  
this day employed in stowing a  
May Wood and ~~so~~ so fourth

Saturday Jan 11<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day light wind  
from the South Eastward filled a  
raft of water and got it on board  
middle part calm latter part light  
winds from the Eastward so ends  
this day two boats of stowing

Sunday Jan 12<sup>th</sup>

First and middle part of this day  
winds N.E. and cloudy weather with  
slight squalls of rain at 7 P.M. the  
boats came on board from gunning  
latter part wind S.W. at 9 P.M. we  
got under way in Berkeley Sound  
bound to sea so ends this day steering  
down the Sound to the Eastward

Monday Jan 13<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day strong winds  
from the S.W. employed in stowing  
away chains took the anchors in on  
deck middle part squally took in  
topgallantsails and double reefed the  
topsails latter part more moderate  
with hole topsails and main topgal  
antsail a Barque ship in sight  
steering N.W. so ends this  
day steering N.W.

Tuesday Jan 14<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day pleasant wind from  
the N.W. steering N.W. at 4 P.M. we  
spoke the Barque ship George and Mearns  
Capt. Smalley of New Bedford 25 months  
out 2100 lbs whale 200 sperm. at 5 P.M. set  
the studsails middle part winds from  
the N.W. with thick weather and fine  
rain took in the studsails latter  
part winds from the N.W. and thick  
weather steering N.E. by N. set topmast  
studying sail so ends this 24 hours  
Lat 47° 57' South

Wednesday Jan 15<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day thick weather  
winds N.W. steering N.E. by N. set  
main topgallant studying sail at 6 P.M.  
the wind hauled to the E. Westward  
took in studsails heading E.N.E.  
11 P.M. wind E.N.W. heading  
N. by E. with thick weather at 3 P.M.  
set studsails winds West  
latter part fine pleasant weather  
winds N.W. with a cross ugly sea  
steering N.E. by N. so ends this day  
Lat 46° 44' South  
Long by Chron 51° 02' West

Thursday Jan 16<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day wind from the Southward  
steering N.W. middle part winds from the  
S.E. and squally with small rain steering  
N.E. by N. latter part winds from the  
N.E. steering on a wind to the Northward  
at 8 P.M. took in studsails one  
sail in sight steering to the Northward  
men employed in repairing the light  
sails so ends this day no whales in  
sight from the mast head  
Lat 45° 43' South
