Friday Jan 24th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather with light winds from the SE steering NE at 10 AM. We hauled to the Eastward took in the Studding sails and headed up heading NE. Nothing in sight from mast head men Variousley employed so ended Lat 41.39.58 South Lon by Chr. 42.06 West

Saturday Jan 25th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather heading NE by E on a wind. Wind from the Eastward middle part latter part light baffling winds and light squalls of rain men Variousley employed in shep'g decks and working on the rigging. Nothing in sight from mast head but two or three fin back whales so ends No Obs

Sunday Jan 26th

First part of this day winds from the Eastward and baffling with light squalls of rain heading to the North and East middle and latter part winds light at dusk heading NW. Nothing in sight from mast head so ends this day Lat 41.38.17 South Lon by Chr 42.20 W

Tacked ship to the Eastward middle part Wind from the Northward and cloudy weather latter part strong northerly winds and rain took in top galant sails and double reefed the topsails took in the main sail and jibs so ends this day No Obs

Tuesday Jan 28th

These 24 hours Commences with fresh gales from the Northward and rainy weather heading to the Eastward under double reefed topsails at 4 PM moderate sett all sail at 6 PM. Lowered one boat for black fish got one and hoisted it on deck at 7 PM. Brought up at the SW steering NE. Sett Studding sails middle part fresh winds from the SW latter part strong winds from the NW at 11 AM took in lower and top galant Studding sails so ends this day Nothing in sight in shape of sperm whales Lat 42.38.56 South Lon by Chr 38.50 West

Wednesday Jan 29th

First and middle part fresh gales from the NW steering NE at 4 PM. Sett top galant Studding sails at 8 PM. Took in top galant Studding sails at 9 PM. Took in flying jib. Gaff topsail and top mast Studding sail at 10 PM. Took in top galant sails and single reefed the topsails at 8 PM. More moderate Sett top galant sails over single reef topsails at 10 PM. The wind shifted to the SW in a squall with rain Sett Studding sails so ends this day moderate SW winds steering NE. Nothing in sight Lat 43.35.15 South Lon by Chronometer 36.42 West
