

Towards the United States 1845
Monday Feb 10th

These 24 hours Commences With light
Winds from the N.W. and calm
With squalls of rain at 9 P.M. light
airs from the N.W. middle part
light winds from the S.W. heading
N.W. latter part light winds from
the W. and fine pleasant weather
leading N.W. men employed
in clearing of the main and
after hatches getting ready for roasting
hole hoisted up two pipes of oil to
Cooper to end this day Nothing
in sight Lat 25° 16' South
Lon by Chr 29° 07' West

Tuesday Feb 11th

These 24 hours Commences With light
Winds from the N.E. and pleasant
weather men employed in stowing
back into the fore hold between decks
getting ready to wet the oil and
drying. bore middle part light
Winds from the S.E. steering
N.W. E. latter part variable and rainy
Weather Wind from N.E. to
S.E. sent the main, mainmast
at 4 P.M. ends this day
Lat 24° 17' South
Lon by Chr 29° 06' West

Wednesday Feb 12th

First part of this day Winds from
the S.E. with squalls of rain steering
N.E. all sail set to best advantage
middle part Wind from the Eastward
latter part Wind S.W. men
employed in knotting yarns and making
rope Commenced working hole this day
one sail in sight steering to
the Southward So ends this day
Lat 22° 52' South
Lon by Chr 29° 13' West

Towards the Steering North
Thursday Feb 13th

First and middle parts of this day Winds
from N.E. to S.W. with squalls of rain
and Wind latter part light airs from
S.W. with squalls of rain and Wind
from the N.W. men employed in
making rope to end this day Nothing
in sight Lat 21° 36' South
Lon by Chr 29° 41' West

Friday Feb 14th

Throughout these 24 hours light baffling winds
from different parts of the compass and
squalls of rain sent the main sail yard
aloft and bent the sail and latter at
4 P.M. saw the Island of Trinidad
bearing N.E. by E. dist 38 miles men
employed in ship duty making rope and
so fourth Cooper employed in making at
New fore topsail yard. So ends this day

Saturday Feb 15th

All these 24 hours light Winds from the N.W.
and N.E. with squalls of rain and Wind
the Island of Trinidad in sight bearing N.E.
at 4 P.M. men variously employed in
ship duty Cooper employed in making at
fore topsail yard one sail in sight steering
on a Wind to the North and West
So ends this day Lat 20° 12' South
Lon by Chronometer 30° 37' West

Sunday Feb 16th

All these 24 hours on steady baffling Winds
from N.W. to N.E. heading from N.W.
to N.W. with occasionally squalls of rain
one ship in sight steering to the
North Westward on a Wind
So ends this day
Lat 18° 16' South
Lon by Chr 31° 23' West
