These 24 hours commences with strong
Northerly Winds under Double reefed

9 A.M. more moderate made
sail as occasion required at 4 P.M.
Spoke the Brig Gazett of Salem
middle and latter parts strong
Northerly Winds at 10 P.M. took in
the flying jib 8 A.M. took in fore
topgallant sail heading NW and
NW by N so ended this Day
With A Cross Sea from the NW

Friday March 28th
First And middle Parts of this Day
Strong Winds from the NW and ENE
and passing clouds 6 A.M. took in
fore topgallant sail and spankers
steering NW by N latter Part
fine Easterly Wind standing sails
all set to the best advantage
And all other sails 5 A.M. Pass
A Barque ship steering to the South
on bent the fore topgallant sail and
repaired it and bent it again
so ended these 24 hours

Saturday March 29th
All these 24 hours fine Easterly wind
and passing clouds steering NW by N
all sail set this Day so ended

Sunday March 30th
First And middle Parts of this Day
Winds from ESE steering NW by N
at 4 P.M. then hauled up NW by N
latter Parts Winds SE and fine weather
steering NW by N so ended this 24 hours
Lat 32° 45' North
Lon By Chr 69° 33' West

Monday March 31st
First Part of this Day fine Winds from
SE steering NW by N middle Part strong
SE Gale at 9 P.M. took in topgallant
standing sails and lower standing sail
and main Royal latter Part strong
gales and rain, thick weather 11 A.M.
took in topmast standing sail so ended
this 24 hours No Observation steering NW

Tuesday Apr 1st
First Part of this Day fresh Gales from the
SE with heavy rain and thick weather
steering NW by N at 1 P.M. took in fore
and main topgallant sails and main
sail jib at 2 P.M. took Double Reefed
the fore topsail at 3 P.M. Double reefed
the main topsail at 4 P.M. took in
the fore topsail steering NW by N
5 P.M. took in the Waste Boats and
hoisted up the quarter boats middle
Part heavy Southerly Gales and thick
rainy weather at 4 A.M. set Close
Reefed fore topsail latter Part Wind
SE and thick rainy weather at 8 A.M.
got to the Northward of the Gulf Stream
kept of NW by N at 11 A.M. Winds
SW both the main sail and jib
at half past 11 took A heavy Squall
from the SW of Wind and rain took
in the main sail blew up the fore
topsail and hauled down the jib blew
up the main topsail

main Buntlines Parted whilst
trying to furl the main sail and
blow to Pieces Not being able
to furl it so ended this Day
No Observation
