Commences with fresh breezes from the E.S.E.  
heading N.E. all hands employed in setting up  
the rigging middle part the same latter part  
more moderate set the Top gallant sails, and Fly jib

Wednesday the 25<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S.E.  
heading E.N.E. one sail in sight. Lowered the  
Boats to practice middle part the same latter  
part squally with rain. took in the Top gallant sails  
and Fly jib two sails in sight. Lat 37. 35 N

Thursday the 26<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh breezes from the S. steering  
E by S one sail in sight. middle part the same  
latter part strong breezes from the S steering E by S

Friday the 27<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W.  
steering E.S.E. one sail in sight middle part  
the same latter part fresh breezes from the  
same quarter steering S.E. took in the Top  
gallant sails

Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh gales from the S.W.  
steering S.E. by E. double reefed the Top sails  
furled the jib several sails in sight middle  
and latter parts more moderate shook the  
reefs out of the Top sails Broke out fore latter.

Outward Bound.  
Sunday the 29<sup>th</sup> of September 1854  
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W.  
steering E.S.E. at 7 P.M. had a squall from the  
S.W. with rain double reefed the Top sails furled  
the jib and mainsail. middle and latter parts  
more moderate made all sail.

Monday the 30<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading  
E with a heavy swell from the S.E. middle and latter  
parts strong breezes from the S took in the Top gallant  
sails double reefed the Fore Top sail with heavy weather.

Tuesday the 1<sup>st</sup> of October.  
Commences with strong breezes from the S.W.  
heading S.S.E. double reefed the Main Top sail.  
middle part the same. Latter part fresh gales  
from the same quarter. furled the jib and  
main sail. Fore Top sail.

Long 30. 30 W

Wednesday the 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Commences with fresh gales from the S.W.  
heading S.E. at 6 P.M. the wind hauled W.  
with rain steering S by W. set the Fore Top sail.  
middle and latter parts light breezes from the  
N.W. made all sail. at 9 A.M. made Course. one  
of the Western Islands bearing S.W.

Thursday the 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences with light airs and calms steering  
S.W. Course in sight middle part light breezes from the  
E.N.E. latter part fresh breezes from the E with rain  
the Ship lying off and on at Flores. Lat no 00
