Friday the 4th of October 1850
Commences with fresh breezes from the E.N.E.
lying of and on at Flores at 5 P.M. the Captain
went ashore, middle part squally, latter part
fresh breezes from the S.E. sent the Boat ashore
to trade, spoke the Brig for Hopkins, 60 lbs

Saturday the 5th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E.
lying of and on at Santa Cruz, Flores several
Boats came along side with recruits, middle
and fine breezes from the S. at 9 A.M. lowered
for a School of Sperm Whales, at 12 past 9 the
Starboard Boat struck one and saved him.
the Bow Boat struck and got Lat 39° 44' N
store  Long 31° 01' W

Sunday the 6th

Commences with strong winds from the
W.S.W. with a heavy swell, all hands employed
in cutting in the Whale, at 6 P.M. finished
cutting the Body, middle part squally with
rain, latter part all hands employed in
cutting the Head.

Monday the 7th

Commences with strong breezes from
the W.S.W. with squally weather, all hands
employed in boiling, middle and latter
parts squally with rain commenced
cutting up the flesh.

W.S.W. with squally weather and rain, all hands
employed in boiling and cutting the flesh
middle and latter parts the same

Outward Bound.

Wednesday the 9th of October 1850
Commences with light breezes and squally weather with
rainy weather, steering W by N, all hands employed in boiling
saw a Brig, middle part squally with rain, latter part
heavy gales from the N.W. cooled down the works, turned
up the Boats the Islands of Corvo, and Flores in
sight, all hands employed in hoisting Casks and
working Ship.

Thursday the 10th

Commences with heavy gales from the N.W.
heading N.W. middle and latter parts more
moderate set the Surron Topsail and Fore Top
mast stay sail at 8 A.M. started the works.

Commences with fresh gales from the N.E.
heading E.S.E. all hands employed in boiling,
broke out for water, middle part the same, latter
part more moderate finished boiling.

Commences with fresh breezes from the E.N.E.
heading S.E. set the jib and mainsail, Fore Topsail
middle and latter parts the same two sails in
sight made all sail.

Commences with light airs from the E.N.E.
heading N. two sails in sight all hands
employed in coopersing etc. middle part
calm, latter part light breezes from the S.W.
steering E.S.E.
