

Ship Abraham, Barker.
Monday the 14th of October 1850.
Commences with fine breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. & exchanged signals with a Brazilian Bark middle part the same at 1 P.M. made the Island of Fayall bearing N.E. at 7 P.M. the captain went ashore the ship lying of and on in company with the Ship China. Sylph. bark Malta. Spartan. and Brig America.

Tuesday the 15th
Commences with fine breezes from the N.W. the ship lying of and on at Fayall at 6 P.M. the captain came on board middle and latter parts the same at 7 A.M. the captain went ashore. Broke out for Bread and Water, banded 65 bbls of Oil.

Wednesday the 16th
Commences with fine breezes from the N.E. the ship lying of and on at Fayall at 4 P.M. the Launet came alongside at 6 the captain came on board and stood to the S.W. by S middle and latter parts light breezes from the E one sail in sight. Lat 37° 22' N
Long no obs.

Thursday the 17th
Commences with light breezes from the E steering S by E middle and latter parts light breeze. Broke out the Fore Hold, one sail in sight. Lat 36° 02' N
Long no obs.

Friday the 18th
Commences with light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. one sail in sight, middle and latter parts fine breezes from the same quarter employed in ship's duties. Lat 35° 00' N
Long 28° 40' W

Outward Bound.
Saturday the 19th of October 1850.
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading S.W. took in the Top gallant sails. Fly jib double reefed the Topsails. middle part strong gales from the S.E. furled the Fore and mizen Topsails, jib and mainsail, and Fore sail. latter part more moderate with rain made all sail the wind backed S.W.

Sunday the 20th
Commences with light breezes from the S.W. heading S.E. middle and latter parts the same saw nothing. Lat 35° 10' N
Long no obs.

Monday the 21st
Commences with light breezes from the S.W. heading S.W. by W middle part fresh gales from the S.E. took in the Top gallant sails double reefed the Topsails. latter part the same. Lat no obs
Long no obs.

Tuesday the 22nd
Commences with fresh gales from the S.E. heading S.W. under single reefed Topsails, one sail in sight middle and latter part more moderate. broke out the Fore hold stowed down salt water. Lat 32° 12' N
Long 28° 52' W

Wednesday the 23rd
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading S.W. middle part more moderate latter part raining took in the Fore and mizen top gallant sails. Fly jib, two sails in sight. Lat 2 no obs
Long no obs.
