Commences with light breezes from the E. steering S.S.W. all hands employed in ships duties middle and latter parts the same two sails in sight saw several Bores.

Commences with fine breezes from the E. steering S.S.W. all hands employed at work on the Riggin middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the N.E. unbent the Main sails and repaired it

Commences with fresh breezes from the N.E. steering S.W. all hands employed in ships duties fitted new Fore Riggin one sail in sight middle and latter parts fresh gales from the same quarter Lat 15.45 S

Commences with fresh gales from the N.E. steering S.W. by S bent the main sail middle and latter parts strong breezes from the N. with rainy weather broke out for latter. Lat no obs.
