N.W. at 1 P.M. lowered the Boats through a mistake
for Sulpher Bottoms. at 3 came on Board one sail in
sight middle and latter parts the same saw a large
Breach. Lat 32° 05' south
Long 83° 14' west

Wednesday the 12th
Commences with fresh breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. by N. employed in ships duties. middle part the
same. latter part light breezes. employed in Coopering
Bread. and Flour. Lat none
Long none

Thursday the 13th
Commences with light breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. by N. employed in Coopering Bread and Flour.
middle and latter parts light and variable winds
one sail in sight. Lat 28° 42' south.
Long 84° 54' west.

Friday the 14th
Commences with light and variable winds
steering N.W. middle and latter parts the same
two sails in sight employed in washing ship.
Lat 27° 34' south

Saturday the 15th
Commences with light breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. by N. middle and latter parts light airs. employed
in repairing old sails one sail in sight.
Lat 26° 29' south
Long none

Sunday the 16th of February A.D. 1851.
Commences with light airs and calms steering N.W.
middle part variable winds. latter part light breezes
from the E. one sail in sight. Lat 25° 24' south
Long 85° 54' west

Monday the 17th
Commences with fine breezes from the E. by S.
steering N.W. by N. middle part sailing. latter part
fine breezes from the S.E. broke out for water
Lat 23° 23' south
Long 87°

Tuesday the 18th
Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. employed in repairing old sails. middle and
latter parts light and variable winds with pleasant
weather. Lat 21° 27' south
Long 87°

Wednesday the 19th
Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. employed in repairing old sails. middle and
latter parts the same. one sail in sight with
pleasant weather. Lat 19° 22' south
Long 87° 28' west

Thursday the 20th
Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. steering
N.W. employed in repairing old sails bent the
Mersey Topsail. one sail in sight middle and
latter parts the same. Lat 17° 24' south
Long 87°

Friday the 21st
Commences with fine breezes from the S.E. steering N.W.
by N. employed in repairing old sails middle and latter
parts variable winds with squally weather. one sail in
sight. Lat 15° 40' south
Long 87°
