Tuesday the 11th
 Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering
 N.N.W. middle and latter parts the same employed
 in ships duties. Lat 6° 41' North.
 Long 120° 30' West.

Wednesday the 12th
 Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering
 N.N.W. middle part the same latter part
 squally at 1 P.M. carried away the fore topsail yard and the
 stings. an Insane Portuguese jumped overboard in a lower
 for him. the Larboard Boat got stove. Lat 7° 47' North.

Thursday the 13th
 Commences with fresh breezes from the N.E. steering N.N.W.
 with rain squalls employed in making a new topsail yard.
 middle and latter parts fresh gales. Lat 8° 54' North.
 Long 125° 31' West

Outward Bound.
 Friday March the 14th A.D. 1851
 Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering N.N.W.
 sent up the fore topsail yard and bent the sail middle
 and latter parts the same. Lat 10° 17' North.
 Long 128° 56' West.

Saturday the 15th
 Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering N.N.W.
 sent up fore and main Bores put a new Boat on the
 Larboard. cranes middle and latter parts the same
 with rain squalls. Lat 12° 00' North.
 Long 132° 45' West.

Sunday the 16th
 Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering
 N.N.W. middle and latter parts more moderate several
 Pinbacks in sight. Lat 13° 13' North.
 Long 136° 07' West.

Monday the 17th
 Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering N.N.W.
 middle and latter parts squally broke out for water
 and bread. Lat 14° 34' North.
 Long 139° 07' West.

Tuesday the 18th
 Commences with fresh breezes from the N.E. steering
 N.N.W. employed in ships duties middle and latter parts
 squally several Pinbacks in sight. Lat 16° 02' North.
 Long 142° 32' West.

Wednesday the 19th
 Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering
 N.N.W. with squally weather employed in ships duties.
 middle and latter parts the same at 4 P.M. part 5.
