Thursday the 20th of March. A.D. 1857.
Commences with strong breezes from the N.E. steering
N.W. by N. employed in ships duties, middle and latter parts
squally with rain. Lat 18.57 North

Long 149.30 West
Friday the 21st
Commences with strong breezes from the E.N.E.
steering N.W. by N. with squally weather. employed in ships
duties middle and latter parts more moderate
with rain squalls. Lat 19.59 North

Long 152.53 West
Saturday the 22nd
Commences with moderate breezes from the E.N.E.
steering N.W. by N. employed in ships duties. looks out for
Sugar middle and latter parts the same employed
in washing ship. Lat 20.54 North

Long 155.45 West
Sunday the 23rd
Commences with fresh breezes from the E.N.E. steering
N.W. by N. at 4 P.M. made the Island of Moorea bearing
N.W. by S. distant 26 miles hauled up the cables and bent
them, removed the studding sail gear and sent the Boats
down, middle part the ship lying back of the passage
at 10 P.M. came to an anchor at Tahiti, in
14 fathoms of water. 21 sail in Port. 24 ends this day.

Commences with fine breezes lying at Lahaina at 5
P.M. took our anchor and steered for Waikiki at 1 made
the Land. at 7 A.M. the Captain went ashore.

Commences with light breezes lying of and on at
Waikiki at 5 P.M. the Captain came on board and
steered for Oahu in company with the ship Gladiator.
middle and latter parts light airs and calms.

Lat 21.20 North
Friday the 11th
Commences with light breezes from the N.E.
steering N.W. by N. at 1 P.M. saw the Island of Oahu
bearing N.W. middle and latter parts the same with
rain squalls lying of and on Oahu at 8 P.M. the
Captain went ashore to get recruits &c.

Saturday the 12th
Commences with light breezes lying of and on
Oahu in company with Bark Alfred Taylor at 6
P.M. the Captain came on board middle and latter
parts fresh breezes from the N.E. steering S.W. under the
cables, and stowed the anchors. Lat 20.50 N

Sunday the 13th
Commences with fresh breezes from the N.E. steering
N.W. by S. two sails in sight middle and latter parts strong
breezes from the E. two sails in sight Lat 20.41 N

Long 165.10 West
Monday the 14th
Commences with strong breezes from the E. steering N.W.
spoke with the ships St. George and Brighton. and
spent the day in gaming middle and latter parts
the same two sails in sight employed in ships duties.
