 winds steering S.W. with thick weather, several
 sail in sight at 1 P.M. saw ^{Laurence} ~~St.~~ Laurence
 Island bearing N.E. by E. Middle past the
 same same latter part strong breezes
 Lat 64 " 13

Sunday } Commenced with fresh breezes from the
 July 24th } to with rainy weather spoke with ships Braganza
 and Gladiator, middle and latter parts
 Light airs with hazy weather. 13 sail in sight
 spoke with ships Pacific, ^{Nassau}~~Nassau~~, and
 George Washington. Left port 84, 30
 Long

July 21st } Commenced with light airs from the E. by E.
steering to the N. through Bheering's straits
several sail in sight. spoke with ship Vingard.
Hoveed for whales without success. Middle
part the same. Latter part fresh breezes from
the N. with pleasant weather.

 July 29th 1851 } Commenced with fine breezes from the N. the ship
 heading on different tracks in Bherings straits.
 spoke with ship John. Wells. Leveir Starbuck,
 and Montfischer. saw several Polar Whales.
 going quick to the N.W. Middle and Latter
 parts fresh gales spoke with ship "Lenas Coffin"
 Lat 64th 51

Wednesday }
July 30th } Commenced with fresh galls from the N.E.
the ship working to the N. several sail in sight
saw several Polar Whales going to the N.W.
Middle and latter part the same with
thick foggy weather. No Observations.

Thursday
July 3rd } Commenced with thick rainy weather. the
wind hauled to the E. one sail in sight the
ship working to the N. through Bherings
straits. Middle and Leather parts moderate
brass spoke with ship Volgai 5 p.m. out.
No Observations.

Friday } Commences with variable winds and
August 26 } Weather the ship being off and on the Land
several sail in sight Middle and latter
parts thick rainy weather. No Observations.

Saturday }
August 12th } Commenced with Easterly winds
with thick rainy weather. The ship heaved
out different tacks spoke with Barb's
Convictors. Middle part the same. Latter
part the Grog Lighted saw the East Cape of
Asia, three sail in sight.
