

Private Journal of a Voyage in "Whale"

Sunday 18th

October 26th Commences with light and variable winds with rain squalls. heading E. S. E. Middle and latter parts light winds from the S. with pleasant weather. Lat 27° 15' Long 152° 25'

Monday

Oct 27th Commences with light winds from the S. heading on different tacks Middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the same quarter employed in ships duties. Lat 26° 32' Long 153° 56'

Tuesday

Oct 28th Commences with fresh breezes from the S. heading on different tacks employed in ships duties. Middle and latter parts moderate winds employed in washing ships. Lat 26° 11' N Long 154° 11'

Wednesday

Oct 29th Commences with light winds from the S. employed in ships duties mended a stowen Boat. Middle and latter parts light and variable winds with rain squalls. Lat 25° 26' Long 153° 13'

Thursday

Oct 30th Commences with light winds from the S. heading S. Middle and latter parts light winds from the S. E. steering S. E. employed in ships duties. Lat 23° 58' Long 153° 13'

Ship "Abner" Barker Bound to the Sandwich Islands

Friday 18th

October 31st Commences with light winds from the S. E. steering S. E. employed in ships duties Middle and latter parts variable winds employed in painting Boats. Lat 22° 20' Long 153° 24'

Saturday

November 1st Commences with light winds from the S. E. steering S. E. employed in ships duties. one sail in sight. Middle part variable winds latter part light winds from the N. E. at 5 A.M. saw the Island of Hawaii Bearing S. W.

Sunday

Nov 2nd Commences with light winds from the S. E. steering for the Passage, at 6 P.M. came to an anchor in 20 fathoms of water. 14 sail in port. more to come.

Monday

Nov 3rd at 6 P.M. took our anchor and made sail for Oahu. at 8 made the Land at 8 A.M. took a Pilot and anchored in the inner Harbor of Honolulu. Plenty of ships and people here men running away and discharged. Honolulu long enough.

So here we leave this place after being 44 days fitting our spars and rigging having new sails made. Drakenburg 700 lbs of Oil to send Home. spending money enough to buy the child of a poor \$4000 coming from the Providence. The remainder on credit. and took of all having with 14 Kanakas before the Mast and 3 Portuguese Boat Steers

So here we go after a voyage
