 came on board and took us under
 the Reef. Middle and Latter part
 the ship lying of and on with
 variable weather.

Wednesday
 Dec 24th

Commenced with fresh breezes from
 the N.E. the ship lying of and on
 Honolulu. Middle part light winds.
 Latter part the same at 10 A.M. the
 Captain came on board and we steered
 to the S.E. bidding adieu to Honolulu
 and the Wharves.

Thursday
 Dec 25th

Commenced with light airs and
 calms heading to the S. employed
 in ships duties. Middle and Latter
 parts variable winds with rain squalls
 the Island of Maui in sight.
 Lat 20.16.

Friday
 Dec 26th

Commenced with variable winds
 with rain squalls heading to the S.
 employed in ships duties. Middle
 and Latter parts strong winds
 from the S.E. heading S.E.
 Lat 17.52
 Long by acct 156.00

 December 27th

Commenced with strong winds from
 the E. heading S.E. employed in
 ships duties. Middle and Latter
 parts the same with rain squalls.

 weather. Middle and Latter parts
