Island in sight Middle part the  
same Latter part high winds from  
the N. E. steering S. by E. with  
Pleasant weather. Lat 11° 02' S  
Long 157° 50'

Monday  
Jan 12th } Commences with light winds and  
Calms steering S. E. Middle and  
Latter parts squally with Rain  
employed in ships duties No Obs

Tuesday  
Jan 13th } Commences with fine breezes from  
the E. steering S. E. with squally  
weather and Rain. Middle and  
Latter parts fresh breezes and Rain.  
squalls Lat 15° 00' S  
Long 157° 18' W

Wednesday  
Jan 14th } Commences with light winds and  
Calms. With squally weather and  
Rain Middle and Latter parts  
the same with light winds from the E  
steering S. by E. Lat 17° 36' S  
Long 157° 36' W

Thursday  
Jan 15th } Commences with light winds from  
the E. heading S. with Rain  
squalls. employed in ships duties.  
Middle part variable winds with  
squally weather. Latter part fine  
breezes from the E. S. E.  
Lat 19° 12' S  
Long 157° 45' W

Monday 1832  
January 16th } Commences with fine breezes from the  
E. S. E. heading S. with squally weather.  
and Rain at 5 P.M. saw the Island  
of Watoo. at 7 tocked ship to the N. E.  
Middle part the same with variable  
winds. at 1 P.M. tocked to the E. S. E. Latter  
part the ship lying of and on Watoo. at  
4 A.M. the Captain went ashore. and  
Plenty of Natives come on Board to trade

Saturday  
Jan 17th } Commences with variable winds with  
squally weather and Rain. the ship  
lying of and on Watoo. with the Captain  
ashore. Middle and Latter parts  
heavy squalls with Rain double reefed  
the Topsails. at 5 A.M. the Captain  
came on Board and stood to the S. E.  
No Obs.

Sunday  
Jan 18th } Commences with strong breezes from  
the E. S. E. heading S. E. under double  
reefed Topsails and Courses Bent a  
New Gib. Middle part squally with  
variable winds. Latter part fresh breeze  
from the E. at 6 P.M. saw the Island  
of Mangear. bearing S. S. W. steering  
for the Land at 12 hauled  
aback of the Landing. a Boat  
came of and the Captain  
went ashore.
