Jan 31<sup>th</sup> } Commences with fresh winds from the E.S.E. heading N. under Topsails and Crosses. Middle part the same. Latter part strong breezes from the E.S.E. steering N by E. Lat 25. 07 S Long 146. 15 W

February 1<sup>st</sup> } Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. steering N.W. by N. Middle part squally. Latter part more moderated at 4 P.M. saw High Island at 8. Landed a Box and the Capt. went ashore. Lat Long 147. 32

Feb 5<sup>th</sup> } Commences with strong breezes from the E. steering N by E. Middle part squally with plenty of rain and lightning. Latter part light winds from E.S.E. employed in ships duties. Lat. 18. 57 S Long

Feb 6<sup>th</sup> } Commences with fresh winds from the E.S.E. heading N.W. with squally weather. at 3 P.M. saw a school of Spine Whales going to the S.W. at 5. the Starboard Boat struck and drew. at 4 past 5 the Larboard Boat struck and got stove. at 8 took the Whale alongside.
