Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> April 18<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh breezes from the E.S.E. steering N.W. by N. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breezes from the S. Lat 22° 53' N Long 175° 50' E

Thursday April 16<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh breezes from the N. steering N.W. Middle and Latter parts fresh gales from the N.E. steering N.W. by N. under double reefed Topsails and Courses with rain squalls. Lat 24° 49' N Long 172° 30' E

Friday April 16<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh gales from the S.E. steering N.W. by N. under double reefed Topsails Middle part the same. Latter part fresh gales from the E.S.E. steering N.W. by N. Lat 25° 00' N Long 170° 46' E

Saturday April 17<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh gales from the E.S.E. steering N.W. by N. Middle and Latter part moderate winds from the S.E. Put the Suttle Butt Below. Lat 29° 11' N Long 170° E

Sunday April 18<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate winds from the S. steering N.W. by N. Middle and Latter parts variable winds with rain squalls and Hazy weather. Lat 30° 55' N Long 170° E

Monday 15<sup>th</sup> April 19<sup>th</sup> Commences with light winds from the S. heading N.W. with hazy weather. Middle and Latter parts light and variable winds steering N.W. with rainy weather (Water) No Observations

Tuesday April 20<sup>th</sup> Commences with light and variable winds steering N.W. with rainy weather. Middle part the same. Latter part fine breezes from the N.W. heading N.E. at 11 A.M. saw three Right Whales, going quick to the N. lowered and chased without success. Lat 33° 00' N Long 168° 10' E

Wednesday April 21<sup>st</sup> Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. heading N.E. took in the Topgallant sails, double reefed the Topsails. Middle part more moderate, Latter part light winds and Calm employed in repairing sails, sent the Main sail down and sent up another. Lat 33° 54' N Long 166° 53' E

Thursday April 22<sup>nd</sup> Commences with light winds from the E.S.E. steering N.W. sent down the main Topsail and repaired it. Middle and Latter parts strong gales from the E.S.E. with plenty of rain. the ship under close reefed Topsails and Foresail, took in the Bow Boat. No Observations

Friday April 23<sup>rd</sup> Commences with strong gales from the E.S.E. steering N.W. by N. under close reefed Topsails and Foresail with rainy weather. Middle part more moderate. Latter part Calm with foggy weather employed in tightening the rope to the Butt lashing spars and sundry jobs too numerous to mention. Lat 37° 30' N Long 165° E
