employed at sundry jobs Middle and Latter  
part the same moved the Log 37<sup>m</sup> 33<sup>S</sup>  
Gally aft. Long E

Sunday  
April 25<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with light winds from the N.W.  
steering N.E.W. with foggy weather. middle  
part the same. Latter part fresh breezes  
from the same quarter with cloudy weather  
Log 37<sup>m</sup> 35<sup>S</sup>  
Long by det 117<sup>m</sup> 2<sup>E</sup>

Monday  
April 26<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with fresh breezes from the  
N.W. steering S.W. with foggy weather.  
Middle part the wind hauled to the N.  
Latter part the same at 5 A.M. hove ship  
to the N.W. Log 41<sup>m</sup> 10<sup>S</sup>  
Long 166<sup>m</sup> 31<sup>E</sup>

Tuesday  
April 27<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with fresh breezes from the  
N. heading N.E.W. with cloudy weather at  
6 P.M. hove ship to the E.S.E. Middle  
part the same. Latter part light winds from  
the N.W.E heading N.W. unbraced the foresail  
and repaired it. Log 41<sup>m</sup> 36<sup>S</sup>  
Long 166<sup>m</sup> 38<sup>E</sup>

Wednesday  
April 28<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with light winds from the  
E.S.E steering N.W. with Pleasant  
weather. Middle part the same Latter  
part the wind hauled to the S.E.  
spoke with ship sea. of 14 or 15  
6 months out clean.  
Log 43<sup>m</sup> 00<sup>S</sup>  
Long by det 166<sup>m</sup> 30<sup>E</sup>

Thursday 1852  
April 29<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with light winds from the N.W.  
with snow squalls heading N.E. & gaming with  
Ship Sea. Middle part the same were ship  
to N.W. latter part light airs and calms with  
Pleasant weather. Log 43<sup>m</sup> 11<sup>S</sup>  
Long E

Friday  
April 30<sup>th</sup> } Commenced with fine breezes from the N.  
steering by N.W. Ship Sea. in sight.  
Middle part fresh gales took in the Top gallant  
sails. double reefed the Topsails. Latter part more  
moderate with thick fog. No Observations.

Saturday  
May 1<sup>st</sup> } Commenced with fresh breezes from the  
N.W. with thick foggy weather. steering  
N.W. with all sail set at 6 P.M. the fog  
lifted. Ship Sea. in sight. Middle part  
strong breezes. Latter part strong gales from  
the S with rain. ship under close reefed  
Topsails. reefed Foresail. Log 48<sup>m</sup> 15<sup>S</sup>  
Long by det 166<sup>m</sup> 15<sup>E</sup>

Sunday  
May 2<sup>nd</sup> } Commenced with strong gales from the  
S.W. steering N. under close reefed topsails  
and reefed Foresail. Middle part more moderate.  
Latter part light and variable winds with  
plenty of Snow. No Observations

Monday  
May 3<sup>rd</sup> } Commenced with fresh breezes from the  
N.W. heading N.E. under easy sail. with  
plenty of Snow. Middle part fresh gales with  
squally weather. Latter part light and  
variable winds. with snow.  
Log 51<sup>m</sup> 40<sup>S</sup>  
Long 166<sup>m</sup> 10<sup>E</sup>
