Monday 1832

July 25th } Commenced with light winds from the E. the ship
lying at anchor. Middle and Latter parts
the same. a plenty of Native visitors aboard.

Tuesday

July 26th } Commenced with light winds from the S.W.
at 6 P.M. took our anchor and stood to the S.W.
Middle part the same Latter part fresh gales
from the S with thick fog. No Observations

Wednesday

July 27th } Commenced with fresh gales from the S.W. with
thick fog. the ship lying aback at 2 P.M.
the fog lifted. saw several sail. and 1 whale
Middle and Latter parts moderate breezes
with rain spoke a French Bark.

July 28th } Commenced with light winds from the S.W.
with thick fog. the ship lying aback. Middle
and Latter parts the same. spoke with ship
Janus & Whales. No Observations

Friday

July 30th } Commenced with moderate winds from the S.W.
with thick fog. weather clearing at 1 P.M. spoke with
ship Bramer. & Whales. Middle and Latter
parts much the same. No Observations

Saturday

July 31st } Commenced with fresh winds from the S.W.
with thick foggy weather. heading S.E.
at 1 P.M. came to an anchor in 26 fathoms
of water. at 9 P.M. Charles, a Sanetwich
Island Native. died. after an illness of 42
days. Middle and Latter parts foggy
the ship at anchor. No Observations

Expanding for Polar Whales in Bhering's Straits 1832

Sunday 1832

August 1st } Commenced with light winds from the E.S.W.
with thick fog. the ship at anchor. at 5
P.M. took our anchor. at 6. Burned the
Dead. at 10 dropped the Anchor. again Middle
and Latter parts Calm. with foggy several
Whales around. No Observations

Monday

August 2nd } Commenced with calm weather with thick
fog. the ship at anchor. spoke with ship
Alfred of the Bedford 11 Whales at 1 P.M.
the fog lifted took our anchor and stood
to the S.W. the Coast of Asia in sight. spoke
with ship Nankar. and Bark Alice Latter
part light air. East Cape in sight.

Lat 65. 46' N
Long 171. 00' W

Tuesday

August 3rd } Commenced with calm weather the ship
of East Cape. Lowered for Whales without
success. several sail in sight. Middle and
Latter parts the same with thick fog.
No Observations

Wednesday

August 4th } Commenced with calm foggy weather
Middle part the same. Latter part light
winds from the S.W. heading S.W.
with pleasant weather several sail in
sight.

Thursday

August 5th } Commenced with light winds from the
N.E. heading S.W. several sail. and plenty
of Whales in sight. Middle and Latter
parts the same. Lowered for Whales without
success.
