Tuesday 1862

September 15th } Commenced with fresh gales from the N.E.
with cloudy weather. Staring S by N. Milder.
and latter parts more moderate. took in
the Bow. Boat and washed her. at 10 A.M.
while in the act of putting her overhead. the
Boat turned over and fell on deck killing the
Cooper. James Blackett. in its fall. aged 52 yrs.

Wednesday

Sept 15th } Commenced with fresh winds from the S.
staring S. with cloudy weather. Middle
part the same. Latter part more moderate
with pleasant weather. Lat 57° 05'

Long 159° 35' E

Thursday

Sept 16th } Commenced with moderate winds from
the N. staring S. with pleasant weather
sent the main Royal yard aloft. bent a fore
mast studding sail. at 6 P.M. Buried the
Cooper. Middle and latter parts light
winds. and calms. several of the Rat. or
Fox Islands. in sight. No Observations

Friday

Sept 17th } Commenced with light variable winds
leading to the S. with cloudy weather. several
of the Rat. or Fox Islands in sight. Middle
part the ship going aback. Latter part
strong winds from the N.E. at 5 P.M. - top
of S.M. Run in between two Islands
But did not find any Passage through
hailed our wind and returned to the Westward
with the Expectations of finding a clear
Passage. before we get to the End of these
courses. to Whalemere.

Saturday 1862

September 18th } Commenced with fresh gales from the N.E.
the ship working to the Westward. to find a Passage
through the Islands. the Land in Sight.
Middle part the same. Staring S. through the
Islands. Latter part more moderate. Staring
S.E. with Pleasant weather. Lat 50° 34'

Sunday

Sept 19th } Commenced with strong winds from the
E. N.E. Staring S.E. Bent a new main
top-sail. Middle part the same. Latter
part strong winds from the N.E. with
pleasant weather. Lat 48° 10'

Monday

Sept 20th } Commenced with fresh gales from the
N.E. staring S.E. & with cloudy weather.
Middle part the same. Latter part strong
winds from the N.W. staring E.S. & bent
out for water. Lat 46° 05'

Tuesday

Sept 21th } Commenced with strong winds from the
W. N.W. staring E.S. & with cloudy weather.
Middle part the same. Latter part light
winds from the S.W. one sail in sight.
Lat 44° 34'

Wednesday

Sept 22nd } Commenced with light winds. and calms
with Raining weather. Middle and latter
parts moderate winds from the N.E.
with Rain.
