March 7th } Commenced with strong gales from the N. steering N. under Double reefed Topsails and Courses with squally weather. at 2 P.M. Close reefed the Topsails furlled the Courses were ship to the S.W. Middle part the same. Latter part more moderate set the Topsails South reefed and Courses were ship to the N.N.E. made near Fox and Main Sacks.

Tuesday

March 8th } Commenced with moderate winds from the N.N. heading N.N.E. Middle part fresh breezes from the N.N.W. Latter part fresh gales from W.W. ship under Double reefed Topsails two sail in sight. Lat 34. 20'

Wednesday

March 9th } Commenced with fresh gales from W.W. steering N.N.W. under Close reefed Topsails and reefed Main sail one sail in sight. Middle and latter parts strong winds from the S.W. made all sail. Several sail in sight. Lat 36. 45'

Thursday

March 10th } Commenced with fresh gales from the S.W. steering N.N.W. at 1 P.M. entered the Gulf Stream. Middle part wind hauled N.N.W. with rain. Double reefed the Topsails were ship to N.N.W. Latter part fresh gales from N.E. several sail in sight. Lat 38. 17' N

March 11th } Commenced with strong winds from the E.N.E. heading N under Double reefed Topsails. several sail in sight. Middle part fresh winds from E.S.E. Latter part thick foggy weather. several sail in sight. Lat 40. 20'

Saturday

March 12th } Commenced with fresh gales from the E. at 1 P.M. were ship to S.W. with thick rainy weather. rounded with 25 fathoms sandy bottom. exchanged Longitudes with Bark Victor of Plymouth. Middle part the same. Latter part wind hauled N. heading on different Sacks. No Observations.

Sunday

March 13th } Commenced with moderate winds from the N heading E.N.E. spoke with Brig Mary Emily. Middle part wind hauled W.W. at 1 P.M. were ship to the S.W. Latter part the same were ship to the N at 11 A.M. saw the Grand Long Island West End. Lat 40. 44'

Monday

March 14th } Commenced with fresh breezes from the N.N. running down the Land. plenty of vessels in sight. at 6 P.M. took a Block Island Pilot. Middle part ship lying of the Bay. at 5 A.M. took a Vineyard Pilot. at 8. Anchored of Clarke's Point
