Monday June the 12th 1842

Lat 37.25 First part small breeze from West Course
Long 65.57 Middle and latter calm the vessel employed in
fitting whale gear Saw a ship heading to the Eastward

Tuesday June the 13th

Lat 38.10 First part small breeze from S by E heading on a wind
Long 66.26 Pleasant latter saw a ship heading to the weather S by E

Wednesday June the 14th

Lat 38.19 First part light air from the S by E heading E by S
Long 62.25 Ship set sail at 7 P.M. started sail Middle and latter
Saw a ship heading to the Eastward latter part of day
the fore top gallant yard set to fit the rigging
this day with all sail set

Thursday June the 16th

Lat 39.38 First part light air from S by E at 2 P.M. set up the fore
Long 61.15 top gallant yard at 5 P.M. hoisted the boats to trim the
Ship the main top gallant yard fitted the rigging and sail on
Saw it up again at 11 P.M. took a small breeze from S by E
Course East so on with all sail set and 2 ships in site

Friday June the 17th

Lat 39.52 Commenced with a fresh breeze from the S by W Course East saw
Long 59.50 a number of vessels at 7 P.M. started sail Middle and latter
latter made all sail at 11 took a top gallant sail S by E
with strong winds from S by E

Saturday June the 18th

Lat 40.16 Commenced with strong winds from the S by W Course East
Long 58.16 at 6 closed reef for the night Middle and latter
Moderate made sail at 11 P.M. saw W by N so on
3 boat steers S by E

On board Brig Bogota

Sunday June the 19th 1842

Lat 40.30 The fore Commenced with a strong breeze from W by N Course
Long 57.17 E by E at 7 P.M. set sail Middle and latter Moderate
Moderate so on this day

Monday June the 20th

Lat 40.52 Commenced with fresh breeze from W by N Course
Long 57.17 E by E at 5 P.M. started sail Middle and latter
Capt. Mops 14 hours out 200 lbs of S.P.M. took in sail
to a close reefed below topsail. With E by E heading South by W
Hearing lots of crying Middle and latter pleasant at 10
P.M. saw a large sperm whale going to the windward
Went down and saw his nose above the sea

Tuesday June the 21st

Lat 41.06 First part fresh breeze from the South heading E by E
Long 57.01 at 4 P.M. started sail Middle and latter
One man Durango latter strong winds Course S by E
Saw a number of ships in site so on this day

Wednesday June the 22nd

Lat 41.15 First part strong winds from S by W Course S by E
Long 56.06 latter pleasant made all sail at 10 took
in top gallant sails so on this day

Thursday June the 23rd

Lat 41.23 First part fresh breeze from S by W Course S by E
Long 56.26 at 7 P.M. started sail Middle and latter
latter strong breeze from S by E so on this day

Friday June the 24th

Lat 41.31 Commenced with strong winds from S by W Course S by E
Long 56.16 at 6 closed reef for the night Middle and latter
Moderate made sail at 11 P.M. saw W by N so on
3 boat steers S by E
