Lat 39.19 Thursday the 7th 1852
 1st Lt. with catons (Hiale) a light breeze
 2nd Lt. with 1000 lbs. of Letter at 10 sent 2 sails at 11 O'clock
 Long 29.04 Saw a whale going to the windward fast supposed to
 be a sperm whale at 12 broke the fore top gallant yard
 on stage so sent away

Friday July the 20th
Commenced with fresh breezes from the N E Course 9 P M
at 4 P M passed a bark sailing with a blue signal
with a white cross & a fast 4 P M sight the bar of
Fayal bearing South distant 30 miles at 8 P M took
the sail at 11 before to make the head yards slack
Later at 8 1/2 P M steamed off for the port at 9 1/2 P M
Gyoke bark & the bar out of bath 8 1/2 P M the red 12000
I end this day beating up for the port Costa

Saturday July the 9th
First part employs a beating for the post at 4 P.M. hired
a boat to go on shore and meet the health officer and have
he come back at 6 P.M. came to anchor at 10 A.M. in 16 fathoms
of water mid part light breeze from the south with pleasant
weather at 11 A.M. captured a great on shore with the post made
master haul down the Great Starboard master mizzen and one of the
Galleons by the name of Kings with superior latter part light
breeze from the NW with pleasant weather all hands employed
Ship Duty -

Goodly July the 10th.
 In the fore part this morn light breezes from the S. with the calmness
 the bar's complexion on ship & early rain fell light breezes
 from the S. & with dark clouds, & rain in fore part light breezes
 from the S. with light rains latter part light breezes from the south
 Pleasant weather winds this day west

morning, July the 11. Discharge commenced with light breezes from the S.W. with light breezes from the N.W. with calms, all hands, in places, at the City and port, light winds and pleasant weather. Light breeze from the S.W. with calms and cloudy weather occurs this day.

Winding Gails the 10th the 24 hours commences with light E^W breezes from the N^W with strong swell from the S^W N^W and pleasant weather this Day saw number of schools of porpoises all bearing in plain on Ship Duty at 6 P^m saw 2 sails in sight at 8 P^m fired top of Gails and hailed the courses with a mid post salmons with pleasant weather at 6 A^m made all sails 6 sails in sight latter Pleasant weather with light breezes from the N^E at 12 mid post Boats at Dist 8 leagues so ends this Day

thurs, July the 14, there been Breeze with light Breezes from the S.W. with pleasant weather with a swell from the S.W. H. G. D. M. taking for me 1/2 of sails and hauled up the Courses and out the weather mid part strong Breeze from the S.W. with Dark, cloudy wet weather at 6 P.M. made all sail latter part strong Breeze from the S.W. with a heavy sea from the S.W. and thick Weather all hands employed in ship Duty around this Day

Monday July the 15. the 4 hours Breeze with strong breeze from the W.
It lay sea from the S.W. with dark clouds, not visible at 8 P.M.
took in 1st on top 2 sails fore & aft and main sails and lost height
Down 1st main top sail at 8 P.M. foul Breeze W.S.W.
Dist. 1/2 miles mid part strong gales from the S.W. at 8 P.M. fresh
Down top sail latter part strong gales with spray sea ground the 1/2

Returning July the 16th to our lower Kingdom with strong gales from the ESW
with strong sea at 4 P.M. caught the fair sail and set it off toward and
lost it mid-past strong gales with heavy rain and cold later part like
had seen from the NW with fresh breeze and the moon the Day

Sunday, July 28th - There were 12 persons with Capt. Brown present at
and took leave at 2 P.M. at the raft at the top and sent
the goods and took at 3 P.M. at the river. Crossing from the
