Commenced with strong breezes from S. by E. steering in a wind to S. by W. with pleasant weather middle part same light in clouds & the latter part same but calmer so ends

Commenced with strong breezes from S. by E. steering in a wind to S. by W. with heavy weather and heavy sea middle & latter part the same so ends

Commenced with strong winds from S. by W. on a wind to S. by E. with pleasant weather middle part strong gales from S. some ship heads N. W. under close reef Main top sail fore & Main topsails latter part more moderate made all prudent sail so ends

Commenced with moderate breezes from S. on a wind to N. S. W. with pleasant weather middle part the same latter part squally light in main top Gallant sail and single reef the topsails so ends

Commenced with moderate winds from S. E. on a wind to S. by E. under all sail middle part squally light in top Gallant sails latter part same S. E. pleasant weather under all sail the same so ends

Commenced with light baffling winds heading to S. E. W. with pleasant weather under all sail middle & latter part calmer so ends

Commenced with strong winds from N. W. steering S. by E. 6 P.M. set main top Gallant sail & sail down fore top Gallant yards & mast middle part same set all sail top mast stop Gallant studdingsails latter part wind N. W. set down studdingsails so ends
