

Remarks on board Monday 17th 1843

commenced with drift as strong breeze. Sailed
to the NW with order to sail wind and
sailed trying to look the Reader at 3 PM
saw the main top gallant gear
at 8. Sailed with the wind to the
SE heading to the NE to SW per
compass with but 6 men able to do
duty at 11. At the spike the Fireman who
was John Dourlan spoke words to the helmsman with
the order to go on all night at 6 light
a way for the helmsman with the chosen
compass heading to the WNW per
compass with thick squally weather.

Thursday 18th

Commenced with thick squally weather
leading to the N by E & S by W up
with the wind to the S by E in company
Lt T. B. with other Commanders at 7 P.M. have a
look at the main signal to the north-
middle to point the same at headland in
Sey's bay. Here with thick rainy weather at dawn ground
by 6 A.M. to go to the North to complete the
intended port part of company with the
Commander of the vessel fire transfer

Thursday 19th

Commenced with ~~the~~ wind from the
N.E. heading to the N.E. per compass
at 5 P.M. saw the National Park Islands
lasing N.E. dist 10 miles. Made 1/2 hour
Lat 6.40 Long 150.00 at 5 P.M.
at 6 P.M. heading to the N.E. with the wind
East NW at 12 noon the wind to the S.W.
Long 39.40 took ship heading to the West
to anchor to the N.E. side of the island with
a N.E. current setting to the North

Remarks on board ^{Thursday} Wednesday 20th 1865

Commenced with strong wind from the NE under all sail heading to the NW per compass at 7 P.M. came to anchor to the NE side of Vanikoro in 18 fathoms of water sanding bottom with a deep compass showing to the North middle of the island. Weathering at 8 AM & Native boat and boards from shore. I took a boat to visit it to the Council & one of my men with them by the name of Christian etc

Dispensation expired 29th

Commences with thick Rainy weather
lying at anchor middle of lower bar
cloudy with rapid currents & ends
with out with strong breeze from East
or the Council

Saturday, April 22nd

commenced with Clouds together with
the wind to the South being at times
with Rapid Currents with strong Sails
from Station or the Council table.
part the same. latter part the Council
left at 12 past noon, 6 men to assist
the men on each.

Sunday April 20th

commenced with fine weather at 6 P.M.
16 Natives came off from shore to assist
us in taking our Stowch & to try to get in
to more shelter. The latter part moderate
winds from the East at 6 P.M. took
our Stowch heading to the North
No end.

Monday April 26th

Commenced with fine weather heading
to the North at 7 PM the North West
of Taurilar bore ~~was~~ 71 N 21 E
2 miles heading to the NW by N
per Compass ~~it is~~ I then came to another
middle of lake. Part strong currents
so well
